## **BRIEF HISTORY**

The Sri Lanka Institute of Architects (SLIA) was formed on 17<sup>th</sup> September 1957, with a Constitution for functioning on the model of the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA). The Institute was incorporated under the “Sri Lanka Institute of Architects Law No. 1 of 1976”, enacted by the National State Assembly of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka . The above Act was amended in 1996 paving way for the creating an Architects Registration Board with powers to register persons qualified to practice the Profession of Architecture in Sri Lanka.

## **4.0 BUDGET OF THE INSTITUTE**

The funds of the Institute are collected from the following sources.

The expenditure of the Institute is authorized at the Procedure Committee and ratified by Council. The annual accounts audited by a private Audit Firm are presented to the General Body at the Annual General Meeting and are ratified by the Membership.

## **5.0 CHAPTERS AND BRANCHES**

SLIA has one Regional Chapter namely, Central Province (Kandy) which is currently in operation.

## 6.0 GENERAL MEETINGS

### 6.1 Quarterly General Meetings

The SLIA has three Quarterly General Meetings of the General Body, held in May, August and November of each year. Major issues and resolutions are taken up and passed at these Quarterly General Meetings.

### 6.2 Annual General Meeting and Annual Sessions



The AGM and Annual Sessions are held in February each year. To coincide with this a National Conference on Architecture, an Exhibition of Members' Works and a Trade Exhibition which is the largest Exhibition in the Building Industry of the Country are also held.

## 7.0 CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CPD) PROGRAMMES AND WORKSHOPS

CPD's are held 3 to 4 times each year. Additionally workshops on subjects of topical interest to Members are also conducted.

Two main CPD's and a mini CPD was held on the following titles in 2015, up to the present.

### 7.1 Mini CPD on *“Building Information Modeling and use of Revit as a Tool of BIM”* on 11<sup>th</sup> June, 2015.

Main CPDs on *“Land Slides and Cut Slope Failures: The Design Challenge”* on 27<sup>th</sup> August 2015 and another on 6<sup>th</sup> November 2015 titled: *“Making it Relevant to Future Generations: Sustainable Heritage Management in the Sultanate of Oman”*.

SLIA also liaised with Toastmasters International and held a Toastmasters Speech Craft Programme which consisted of ten sessions



## ***7.2 SLIA – Sustainable Performance Evaluation Criteria Index (SPECI)***

The Building Performance Index, a certification system which is to be used both for old buildings as well as those recently constructed, was launched and two members of SLIA carried out a survey of two buildings identify by SLIA using the building performance index in order to identify whether the buildings conform to the expected standards. The survey was completed recently.

## **8.0 REGISTRATION AUTHORITY OF ARCHITECTS – THE ARCHITECTS REGISTRATION BOARD (ARB)**

The Registration Authority for the Architects to practice the profession in Sri Lanka – The Architects Registration Board was established under the provision of Sri Lanka Institute of Architects Amendment Act No 14 in 1996. The Act requires and mandates persons who are eligible to practice the Profession of Architecture in Sri Lanka to register themselves under the ARB. There are three categories of Registration – namely ‘Chartered Architects’, ‘Architects’, and ‘Architectural Licentiates’. The Chartered Architects are members of SLIA, other two categories are for non members.

Currently over 1116 persons are Registered in the Board as at 1<sup>st</sup> October 2015. The Board is chaired by a Past President of the Institute. The current Chairman is Past President **Ar. Ranjan Nadesapillai**. The names of members registered under the ARB are annually published in the government gazette. The ARB issues official rubber stamps annually to all members registered under the Board.

SLIA Members attended the CAA Golden Jubilee Celebrations hosted by RIBA 15<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> June 2015. President, Immediate Past President and Senior Vice President were the official delegates of SLIA. An SLIA tour of Ireland, Scotland, Wales and England was arranged to coincide with the CAA event. 25 SLIA Members participated in the tour, of whom 18 attended the Conference as well. ### **10.3 *International Union of Architects (UIA)***

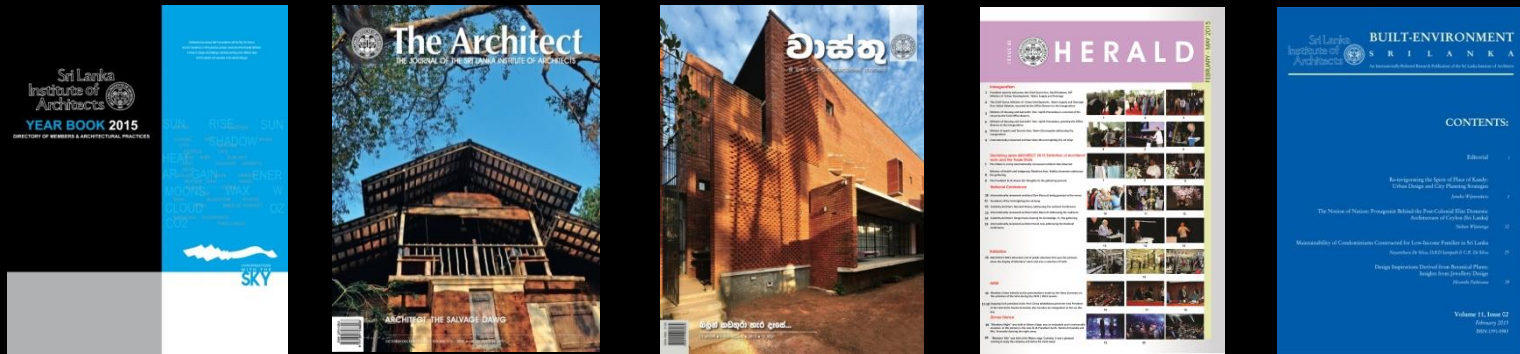
The SLIA is also a Member of UIA. Past President Archt. Jayantha Perera serves as the Director for the UIA Work Programme Responsible Architecture.

**11.1** The Annual Members Directory & Year Book published in February each year, has been given a new look in a New Format. The book contains information of SLIA members and practices.

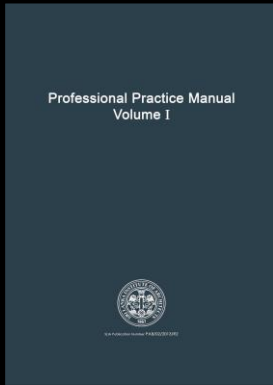
**11.2** “**THE ARCHITECT**” is a quarterly English Publication circulated locally and internationally, with a complete new look.

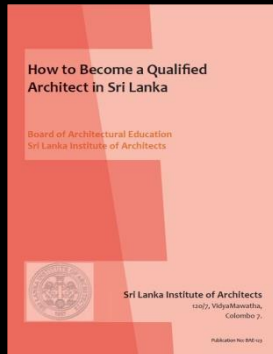
## 11.6 SLIA Practice Manual



The Professional Affairs Board of SLIA is in the process of expanding its existing 02 volumes of practice manuals. The new edition of volume 1 will include both office as well as project practices and will be published as “Managing a Practice”. The Volume 2 “Standard Forms” will include only forms used for office and project practices

## 11.7 Student Internship Programme

Student internship programme is ensured by the requirement of practical training obtained under a Chartered Architect and monitored by the BAE for either 2 years (fulltime) or 2 years part time+1 year full time depending on the full time / part time nature of the architectural programme.



**11.8** The BAE has now implemented the new Training Experience Record Book (TERB) of which the purpose is to give employers and trainees necessary guidance and directions to fulfill the training requirements set out by SLIA as partial requirements to sit the examinations and to obtain memberships.

This Record Book directly indicates the exposure levels required for various phases of the design and building process. It also requires detailed records by the candidates and integrates the concept of employment ‘mentor’, as being a chartered architect in that particular practice responsible for the training of the student, and acts as his guiding light.

## 12.0 MAJOR ACTIVITIES DURING THE SESSION 2015/16.

### 12.1 Architect 2015

The Inauguration Ceremony was held on 17<sup>th</sup> February 2015 at the Main Assembly Hall, BMICH. Hon. Rauff Hakeem Minister of Urban Development, Drainage & Water Supply was the Chief Guest on the occasion since His Excellency Maitripala Sirisena President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka who was invited to grace the occasion of Chief Guest, left on a visit to China. Hon. Sajith Premadasa, Minister of Housing & Samurdhi and Hon. Navin Dissanayake, Minister of Tourism & Sports were the Guests of Honour. Archts. Glenn Murcutt of Australia and Kengo Kuma of Japan provided brief introductory outlines of their work.



Around 1100 Members and distinguished invitees were present on the occasion. 68 new Associate Members were presented with their scrolls of membership and 04 Members were conferred the Fellow Membership.

The Theme for “**Architect 2015**” was “**CONVERSATIONS WITH THE SKY**” It was held from 17<sup>th</sup> to the 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2015.

## 12.3 National Conference 2015



The National Conference 2015 was held at the Main Assembly Hall, B.M.I.CH on 18<sup>th</sup> February 2015, the Theme being “*Conversations with the Sky*”.

Presentations were made by Archts. Vinod Jayasinghe, Palinda Kannangara, Philip Weeraratne, Hiranti Welandawe. The Foreign Speakers at the Conference were Archt. Glen Murcutt of Australia, Archt. Kengo Kuma of Japan, Archt. Bernard Khoury of Lebanon and Archt. Kevin Low of Malaysia.

The Conference was well attended with approximately 1000 participants including delegates from India and Bangladesh, who arrived in Sri Lanka solely for the Conference. Students of the University of Moratuwa and the City School of Architecture were also present.



Archt. Peshali Perera Chaired the National Conference 2015 ably supported by Archt. Madhura Prematilleke as Convenor.

## 12.4 Architect 2015 – Members' and Trade Exhibition

The Exhibition Committee for Architect 2015 was chaired by VP Archt. D H Wijewardena. It was concluded successfully with 294 trade Stalls all sold out and a demand for even more. The income received from the Trade Exhibition totalled Rs: 55,416,136/= Special thanks to Chairman Archt. D H Wijewardena and his Committee Members of the Trade Exhibition for the unprecedented success of the exhibition.



An additional feature of this Exhibition was the unannounced and surprise visit of His Excellency the President of Sri Lanka on his return from a tour of China.

SLIA sponsored 100 students from two schools in the north of Sri Lanka who were granted the opportunity to visit the Exhibition and an overnight stay and tour of the City of Colombo.

According to records around 29,300 tickets were sold to the General Public besides Students from Schools & Universities who were granted free entrance to the Exhibition. The total income received on ticket sales was Rs. 1,465,000/= (net).

The Board of Architectural Publications, maintained a stall for the sale of publications of SLIA, with total sales figure of Rs. 265,000/= (net) collected from this stall.

A new format for Members Panels was devised by Chairman Exhibitions Committee Archt. D H Wijewardene which proved very successful. A total of 136 Members Panels were on display @ Rs. 16,000/= per panel netting LKR. 1,900,000/= in income.

## **13.0 OTHER ACTIVITIES**

### **13.1 *Establishing Associations under the Umbrella of SLIA***

The SLIA established the **Sri Lanka Project Managers Association** under its umbrella. Two other Associations - **Sri Lanka Association of Interior Architects** and **Sri Lanka Association of Urban Designers** are being formed.

The Associations will conduct courses and related programmes for the benefit of the membership aimed at equipping members of SLIA with skills and qualifications in specific areas.

## 13.2 Jaffna Regional Exhibition, Forum and Architectural Clinic

SLIA organized an Exhibition, Forum and Architectural Clinic from the 15<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> October in Jaffna, 350km away from the Capital, Colombo to coincide with the restoration of a 100 year-old school library building at the Vivekananda Vidyasalai in Manipay. The Exhibition was held for 2 days while the Forum and Architectural Clinic ran concurrently with it. The event, the first of its kind held in Jaffna by SLIA, was a tremendous success, it being the first time that the citizens of Jaffna had the opportunity to witness an Architectural Exhibition. SLIA Members spent 3-nights and 4-days in Jaffna during the event.



## ***13.2 Design Competitions***

Design Competitions are conducted by SLIA among its members for Clients who request the services of SLIA in this sphere. Two such competitions being conducted currently are:- The Design Competition for the Sri Lanka Sustainable Energy Authority (SLSEA) – to cater to their requirement of an energy efficient state-of-the-art building. The second being, the Construction of a large Sports Complex in the north of the Country.

## **14.0 CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY PROJECTS & NEWS**

### ***14.1 Rehabilitation Building for Spinal Cord Injured Patients***

SLIA was invited to be a stakeholder in a project to establish a rehabilitation and special care center for patients with spinal cord injuries. SLIA Members are actively involved and provided consultancy services during its construction and selection of equipment/fittings for the facility thereafter. Archt. Dilummini De Mel is the Chairperson of this project.

## **14.2 Jaffna Manipay Vivekananda Vidyasalai Renovation Project**

Under the Chairmanship of Vice President Archt. D H Wijewardene and his Committee SLIA restored a 100-year-old school library building in the far north of Sri Lanka to its original state. This building was set to be demolished and replaced with a new building. At a cost of Rs:2.0 million SLIA completed the restoration as yet another CSR project for 2015. The renovated Library was handed over to the school at a grand function attended by politicians in the north as well as SLIA Council members who travelled a distance of over 350 kilometers to take part in the handing over ceremony.



### **14.3 Concessionary Loan Facilities for Members to participate in International Events**

With the approval of its Council, the SLIA provides interest free loans to its members, which are deductible in small monthly instalments, to encourage its members to take part in international Architectural Conferences and Tours.

### **14.6 SLIA Staff Welfare Association**



Apart from the usual fringe benefits provided to the Staff, SLIA to fund the SLIA Staff Welfare Association with an annual grant 100,000/= and provide venues for the association to hold its meetings. The SLIA Staff and their families took part in a 3-day north of the Country as its most recent outing.

### **14.7 School Awareness Programme**



The SLIA continuing its regional programmes has embarked on promoting architecture as a profession with pre-University level students and has held a number of Awareness Programmes in rural schools.

## 14.8 Students' Jamboree Activities 2015



Student Jamboree 2015 organized by the Board of Architectural Education (BAE) of SLIA was held very successfully in September 2015 at a location called Kithulgala, in Sri Lanka which is a rural village about 75 km away from Colombo. 50 students each from two architecture schools UoM and CSA participated in this 3 day programme.

The Leadership and confidence building activities including the “Water Rafting” which is a very popular adventure activity among the local and foreign tourists visiting this area. The Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) aspect of the programme of cleaning and painting a government school building in that area was another success where the students of architecture, painted the two storied school building within a day using the paints provided by a sponsor.

Participants were very much enthusiastic with all the creative activities and short dramas etc. they had to perform during limited time periods given for preparation. The outcome was of high quality and very enjoyable.

At the end of the programme the feed- back of the participants were also very encouraging.

## **14.9 SLIA Sports Committee**

## 14.11 Fellowship Nite 2015



The Fellowship Nite, the culminating event of the Annual Sessions was held on Saturday the 21<sup>st</sup> February 2015 at Waters Edge Hotel and was themed "SKYFALL". Around 470 revelers, including Past Presidents, Senior Members, Sponsors, Allied Professionals & State Sector Officials attended the event which ended with a positive mark in the early hours of the morning.

## 15.0 KEY ISSUES FACED BY THE PROFESSION OF ARCHITECTURE

Some key problems faced by the Architects and the Profession in Sri Lanka are set out below.

- a There are Foreign Architects involved in projects without collaborating with local Architects. SLIA has requested Government intervention in this regard. We recommend the Council of ARCASIA informs members of respective institutes to abide by the UIA Convention that stipulate guidelines for cross border practices.
- b The Government has introduced an amendment to the provisions in the Urban Development Authority Act recognizing a category of vocation as a qualified group to design and certify residential buildings up to 400 sq. m and non-residential buildings up to 200 sq. m. The SLIA continues to lobby with the relevant authorities on the dangers of such action can cause to Society and the Built Environment.
- c The design and build type of contracts are becoming the order of the day in the private and Government sector .This gives a low priority to design in building projects.
- d Major Government projects are being awarded primarily to Government Agencies who also offer in-house Architectural Services, thereby depriving the private sector (in which more than 80% of the architects are employed).
- e Government Agencies continue to encourage fee bidding among Architects.
- f Other professionals and Professional Bodies have sprung up poaching into traditional territories of the Architect (eg. Project Management, Interior Design, Urban Design).
- g The need to request the government to offset the escalating cost of construction due to the high cost of building material, either by importing construction material and lifting the restrictions on certain available material.

## 16.0 PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

- a To continue to expand the public outreach programme by hosting regional seminars and exhibitions.
- b To continue to give publicity to architecture and the practice of architecture through both the print and electronic media by one-on-one interviews on local television stations.
- c To prepare a corporate plan incorporating Members to cushion the impact of WTO liberalization practices.
- d To lobby Government Institutions to enforce the laws pertaining to “qualified persons” in the building industry, and to adopt the UIA Policy Directive on cross-border practice of Architecture.
- e A programme for young Architects to develop as professionals and to gain more recognition in the community is being implemented.
- f To enhance the Continuing Professional Development Programmes, focusing on the impacts of global trends.
- g The SLIA has also taken the initiative to guarantee Professional Indemnity for Members of SLIA.
- h All Members of the Institute have also been issued with Membership Identity Cards.
- i The SLIA has developed a new procurement system and proposals have been presented to the Government for submission as a Cabinet Memorandum. This system is expected to bring in redress to the Membership facing major problems due to lack of work as a result of the economic downturn. Based on this SLIA intends to establish a consultancy Unit. It is an attempt to pave the way for the SLIA to obtain Government projects and distribute among the practices based on a Tripartite Agreement.
