1.0 BRIEF HISTORY

The UAP was born on December 12, 1974 out of the noble vision of unifying the three (3) existing architectural associations in the Philippines then, namely the PIA, LPA and APGA. With this vision, the officers and members of the three organizations exerted efforts to orchestrate and integrate their common interests, functions and objectives.

On March 26, 1975, the UAP was registered with the Philippines Securities and Exchange Commission and was granted Certificate No. 001 being the first professional organization to be accredited by the Professional Regulations Commission. Since the date of its registration, it has received many professional awards including the highly acclaimed Excellence Award given by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines.

FOR THE THIRD TIME, the United Architects of the Philippines has been awarded the 2008 Professional Regulation Commission's Most Outstanding Accredited Professional Organization (APO) last June 20, 2008 at the Fiesta Pavillion, Manila Hotel during the celebration of the 35th PRC Founding Anniversary. UAP is the first and only APO to receive the Most Outstanding APO Award thrice (Years 2002, 2007, 2008) in the award's fourteen-year history, and the only APO to win the award in consecutive years (Year 2007 and Year 2008).

On winning the 2008 Most Outstanding APO award, UAP National President Arch. Medeliano T. Roldan, Jr. said, "UAP is indeed honored to receive this prestigious national award that recognizes the dedication and commitment of the administration

in building a prime professional organization of architects, a community that accommodates different views and allows diverse talents to flourish. While this award marks a significant milestone in our journey towards professional excellence, it is not the end of our quest for continuous improvements. The 2008 Most Outstanding APO Award will spur us to reach for greater heights."

NP Roldan said that the award will engender a spirit of adventure and encourage each of us to strike out with confidence and our unrelenting quest for excellence in the virtuous circle of creating, imparting and applying knowledge.

The Most Outstanding APO Award, the highest award that could be conferred upon an accredited professional organization by the PRC which is the central agency of the government charged with the licensing and regulation of professionals and the professions as well as the APOs, is presented annually to recognize the achievements, services and commitment of the APO to the profession.

UAP bested other 42 professional organizations based on the following criteria set by the Commission for the 2008 Most Outstanding APO: (1) Leadership and initiative in participating in PRC activities and/or PRC sponsored programs/activities; (2) Quality of performance of service of nominees appointed to the Regulatory Boards in terms of validity and reliability of test questions prepared and asked in the licensure examinations, participation in other regulatory functions and in PRC programs, projects, and activities; (3) Quality and relevance of CPE programs administered and implemented by the organizations; (4) Significant achievements as a corporate body (a) in attaining the objectives of the organization, (b) in the enhancement of the welfare of its members in terms of placement and of assistance in the practice of the profession, and (c) in the enhancement of the stature/prestige of the profession; (5) Effective discharge of the profession's social responsibility through meaningful participation in socio-related activities; (6) Relationship of the officers and members of the APO with officers and members of the other registered professional organizations in the same profession in terms of camaraderie, fellowship, cooperation in national programs and activities of the professions; (7) Leadership and initiative in undertaking programs, projects and activities related or unrelated to the practice of the profession, as well as improvement and/or contribution to the solution of problems affecting the profession, which redound to the benefit of its members and to the community/country in general; (8) Healthy relationship with the PRC and the Professional Regulatory Board concerned

in terms of cooperation and coordination; (9) Smooth turn-over of duties and responsibilities of outgoing, to newly-elected and inducted officers of the organization, through peaceful and orderly elections, and initiative and leadership in the integration of all professionals into one organization; (10) Sponsorship of international conventions, conferences, workshops, symposia, and other similar gatherings of professionals; (11) Regular publication of news bulletin and technical journals and submission of annual reports (financial and operations) to PRC and SEC, and (12) Acquisition of own building and maintenance of the financial solvency of the association.

In recognition of its exemplary volunteer work in addressing housing problems, urban degradation and environmental conservation and promotion of volunteerism for socio-economic development, the United Architects of the Philippines was chosen as a Regional Nominee to the **Search for Outstanding Volunteers by the Philippine National Volunteer Service Coordinating Agency (PNVSCA)** in conjunction with the celebration of National Volunteer Month last December 2005.

Under the administrative supervision of the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA), PNVSCA is the government agency mandated to promote and coordinate volunteer programs and services in the Philippines. PNVSCA closely works with other government agencies, non-government organizations, the academe, the corporate group, the media and other partners in converging and linking the different volunteering efforts and resources so that they are aligned with national priorities and assist especially the marginalized sectors and communities. PNVSCA takes the lead in advocating and

recognizing the contributions of volunteers to nation-building and international cooperation.

With the passage of the "**Architecture Act of 2004**" or **Republic Act (RA) No. 9266** in April 2004, the UAP was officially recognized as the Integrated and Accredited Professional Organization of Architects (IAPOA). The new law granted Filipino architects more definitive rights, benefits and distinction as against other professionals in the construction industry. Over time, the UAP therefore has achieved milestones one after another which have carved a niche in the chronicles of professional organizations in the Philippines.

2.0 CORPORATE THEME

The current administration has adopted the theme of "**UNIFIED ACTION Geared Towards Professional Excellence**" for fiscal year 2008-2009. This theme concentrates on the following objectives, to wit:

1. To safeguard and protect the practice of the architecture profession;
2. To establish the highest standards of ethical conduct and professional excellence;
3. To promote and propagate the value of architecture;
4. To maintain the highest standards of architectural proficiency;
5. To assist members in executing contracts with clients;
6. To increase membership;
7. To review and update UAP documents;
8. To continue image build-up of UAP;
9. To complete the evaluation manual of the 10 yr. long range plan;
10. To increase generated annual income by 10%;
11. To address environmental concerns and protection;
12. To upgrade level of professionalism of UAP secretariat;

13. To uplift the quality of architectural services and documentation to meet global standards;

14. To network with friends in the industry.

Based on these, the administration adopted its flagship projects for the fiscal year 2008-2009.

4. MEMBERSHIP STRENGTH

The UAP has a roster of membership numbering more than 22,000 or 100% of the total registered architects at the Professional Regulations Commission (PRC). This number is expected to increase with the advent of the automatic membership clause under RA 9266 and the registration of newly board passers of the recent PRC licensure examinations. As of today, there about more than 6,000 UAP members in Good Standing for the Fiscal Year 2008-2009.

5. BUDGET

The Executive Committee has approved a total revenue budget of Php17,635,000.00 or roughly about **US\$ 352,700.00** for fiscal year 2008-2009, while the expenditure budget amounting to Php15,455,800.00 or roughly about **US\$309,116.00**

7. ANNUAL MEETING AND CONGRESS

The UAP holds two (2) major national gatherings annually - the National Convention & Annual Business Meeting, which is held usually near the end of the fiscal year (April) and the Mid-term National Conference of Architects (NCA), held in October.

The National Convention & Business Meeting is usually held in Metro Manila, the most recent of which was the 34th UAP National Convention held SMX Convention Center, Philippines last April 23-25, 2008, and was highlighted by the following activities:

- a. Seminars and Workshops
- b. Conventions and Construction Expo
- c. Various meetings and fora
- d. National Election which the present National President, **Arch. Medeliano T. Roldan, Jr., fuap** was reelected the mandate of the general membership for the second term.

On the other hand, the National Conference is held alternately in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao. The midterm NCA is generally formatted as a "learning forum, where majority of its agenda is focused on seminars and symposia, lectures, and product/ technology presentations. This year, the 17th **UAP National Conference of Architects** was held last week, October 23-25, 2008 at Grand Regal Hotel in Davao City, Philippines with the theme of Sidlak Sang Madayaw Na Kagikan (Roadmap to the Future) "**Roadmap to the Future**".

Both national gatherings are venues for ratifications of vital Board decisions and actions by the general membership.

8. LEGAL STATUS OF UAP IN THE PHILIPPINES

With the passage of the **Architecture Act of 2004**, the UAP has recently been recognized as the **Integrated and Accredited Professional Organization of Architects (IAPOA)** in the Philippines. As such, it is the only architects' organization with which the Philippine Government and its instrumentalities communicate and coordinate with on matters pertaining to or affecting the architectural profession in the country.

9. LEGAL STATUS OF THE ARCHITECTS IN THE PHILIPPINES

The Filipino Architect is a respected professional in the Philippines licensed by the Professional Regulations Commission after finishing a 5-year tertiary education and 2-year apprenticeship or diversified experience, and after passing the government licensure examinations.

In the Philippines, the architect is the "prime" professional for the building and construction industry.

10. REGISTRATION AUTHORITY FOR ARCHITECTS IN THE COUNTRY

The Professional Regulations Commission (PRC), through the Board of Architecture (BOA), is the sole government agency which has the power and authority to give license to professional architects in the Philippines.

The PRBoA is composed of a Chairman and two Commissioners who are appointed by the President of the Philippines from a short list of nominees recommended by the UAP.

The PRBoA maintains a high but realistic level of architecture licensure examination (ALE) to assure acceptance of quality professionals.

The PRBoA also focus on architectural specializations and their subsequent classification to fully integrate them with the Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Programs. Architects will be required to undergo such specializations utilizing these programs. The Board will validate recommendations of UAP Specialty Councils for the granting of PRBoA Architecture Specialization Certificates. The Board also envisions using CPD units when earned as possible equivalent credits leading to a formal degree granted by local institutions offering higher studies in architecture. This will make the CPD

units a more valuable tool for self-improvement by every RLA. Thus eventually, an Architect Classification, Ranking and Promotion System based on the number of specializations gained can be developed which also can become a basis for charging the proper professional fees.

To date, the PRBoA is coordinating with legal entities in government such as the PRC Legal & Investigation Division and its Special Prosecutor who was only recently assigned to the PRBoA, the Department of Justice (DoJ) Central Office and its local prosecution offices, the Ombudsman and Sandiganbayan (for cases involving government officials refusing to implement and enforce RA 9266 despite PRBoA notices), and to include a possible PRBoA Private Legal Counsel and/or private investigator who will collaborate with the PRBoA Special Prosecutor assigned by the PRC.

12. MAJOR PROGRAMS AND FLAGSHIP PROJECTS

• Overview: Preparing Major Programs and Projects Through a Corporate Planning

UAP's major programs and flagship Projects are being prepared through a corporate planning. UAP Corporate Planning Workshop is one of the major activities of every administration. UAP defines its annual corporate planning as an analytical process which involves [1] an assessment of the future, [2] the determination of desired objectives in the context of that future, [3] the development of alternative courses of action to achieve such objectives, and [4] the selection of a course, or courses, of action from among the alternatives.

In relation with this description, the administration of Arch. Medeliano T. Roldan, Jr., fuap, conducted two planning workshops: the Pre-Corporate Planning Workshop and UAP Corporate Planning Session both held in the month of June 2008.

The Pre-Planning Workshop enables the organization to be proactive and to actively shape its own destiny prior to the holding of an actual corporate planning session. Participants in the Pre-Planning Workshop were the following: incoming members of the Management Committee (National President, National Executive Vice President, Secretary General and Treasurer), Outgoing National President, Incoming Executive Directors of UAP Standing Commissions, Chairpersons of UAP Standing Committees, Incoming Project Directors of UAP Task Forces and members of the UAP Administration Office.

Guided by the results of the **UAP 10 Year Long Range Plan**, each Commission together with their respective committees were given time to a) develop a shared vision and definition of success, b) identify barriers and opportunities for success c) determine practical strategies for achieving identified goals and d) establish priorities for action.

After the formal introduction and presentation of the objectives of the said session, each Commission presented their outputs to the Area Vice Presidents and their respective Districts for adoption.

• Results

1. **Monitoring of Republic Act No. 9266, otherwise known as the Architecture Act of 2004.** The direction of this program is: a) To facilitate the information dissemination of the RA 9266 to the architecture community as well as to local government units b) To properly identify the procedures on how to implement the provisions of the RA 9266. c) To meticulously monitor the bills of other allied professions with the objective of safeguarding the RA 9266, its intents and its substance.

Subsequently, the UAP National President issued Executive Order to strengthen the Task Force R.A. 9266.

2. **Revisit and Amend Architects Code of Ethics and Standards of Professional Practice.** This program aims to coordinate with various stakeholders in amending the Code of Ethics and Standards of Professional Practice.
3. **Intensify information campaign regarding the importance of architectural services and the architect's role in the building industry.** This program aims to maintain professional competencies through Continuing Education and Publications and Architectural Information networking.
4. **Collaboration with Local Government Sectors and Other Government Agencies concerning the Licensing and Regulation of the Profession.** This program focuses on the establishment of coordinating center to collaborate with local government authorities and agencies in the licensing and regulation of the architecture profession.
5. **Cooperate and Coordinate with Other Allied Professions, Trade and Industry.** This program concentrates on linkages with allied professions, i.e. engineering.
6. **Continuing Professional Education and Development of Architects.** It is the position of the UAP that continuing professional development should be a life-long endeavor of all professionals to maintain, enhance and increase knowledge and continuing ability. Keeping abreast with new technologies, methods of practice, and changing social and ecological conditions is a responsibility of each individual architect to safeguard public safety; the welfare and health. Thus this program deals primarily on the establishment of Continuing Professional Education.
7. **Institutionalization of Specialty Council.** UAP had always had the stand that Continuing Professional Education (CPE) is an important program in the professional development of the architect. In this case, this program will develop a system to motivate members positively, by which UAP may be able to evaluate and recognize achievements of architects in continuing professional development so that they may be qualified to be called experts or specialists for certain kinds of architectural typology or service.
8. **Collaboration with Academe regarding relevant curriculum and supplementing training programs and seminars.** As an objective basis for the UAP officers in defining the policy directions and designing possible interventions regarding architectural education, it was deemed

necessary to collaborate with the academe sector and among selected architectural educators in the country to study and evaluate the architecture curriculum.

9. **Membership Recruitment Program.** This program deals with active recruitment membership policy to encourage members to become active with the UAP.
10. **Active Participation of UAP in the Global Arena.** This program encompasses the active participation of UAP in the international undertakings related to the profession.
11. **Networking with Allies in the Construction Industry.** To develop comprehensive program and policies on how to enhance connectivity and working relationship with allied professionals and friend in the construction industry, particularly the suppliers and manufacturers.

• **Identified Flagship Projects**

1. **Task Force 9266.** The Task Force is tasked to facilitate the information dissemination of the RA 9266 to the architecture community as well as to local government units, to properly identify the procedures on how to implement the provisions of the RA 9266 and to meticulously monitor the bills of other allied professions with the objective of safeguarding the RA 9266, its intents and its substance.
2. **Monitoring of 10-Year Long Range Plan.** The adoption of the UAP comprehensive 10-year Long Range Plan (LRP) necessitates the present administration to establish a monitoring group to evaluate and monitor the implementation of the UAP 10-year Long Range Plan
3. **APEC Architect Register.** In an effort to help the profession offer architectural services throughout the Asia Pacific region, the United Architects of the Philippines has joined with architectural associations around the Pacific rim in launching the APEC Architect Register - Philippines Section last September 19, 2005 held at the Pandango Room, Manila Hotel. This flagship projects is a response to the strategic priority of facilitating mobility of qualified persons through the mutual recognition of professional qualifications among countries. Through the APEC Architect Registry, qualified

Filipino architects will be internationally accredited for the practice of their profession in member countries.

The Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC), is an international forum composed of twenty-one member economies that have undertaken to act collectively to promote economic and technical cooperation within the Asia-Pacific region. On the initiative of the APEC Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG), one of the sectoral groups established to implement APEC programs, the APEC Architect Project was endorsed as a direct response to the strategic priority of facilitating the mobility of qualified persons by developing a means for the mutual recognition of qualifications.

The APEC Architect Project builds on the World Trade Organization (WTO) General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS) principles for the progressive liberalization of trade in services through the reduction of regulatory restrictions, leading to reciprocal agreements between member economies.

The APEC Monitoring Committee Philippine Section, composed of the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP), Philippine Regulation Commission (PRC) and the Commission of Higher Education (CHED), recently launched the APEC Architect Register simultaneously with other APEC-member countries.

UAP already confirmed 27 Filipino architects as APEC Architect Register.

Due to a requested deferment by the USA of its 2009-2010 hosting assignment for the APEC Architect Registry Secretariat, the Philippines through the initiative of UAP National President, Arch. Medeliano T. Roldan, Jr., fuapas supported by the three (3) Philippine Monitoring Council members, offered to undertake the two (2)-year hosting of the APEC Architect Registry Secretariat in Manila.

The fourth (4th) Central Council meeting of the APEC Architect Project shall also be held in Manila sometime in October 2010.

- 4. UAP Specialty Councils and Continuing Professional Development.** This flagship project will develop a system to motivate members positively, by which UAP may be able to evaluate and recognize achievements of architects in continuing professional development so that they may be

qualified to be called experts or specialists for certain kinds of architectural typology or service.

Since it is the position of the UAP that continuing professional development should be a life-long endeavor of all professionals to maintain, enhance and increase knowledge and continuing ability, the present administration maintains the establishment of CPD program as one of its flagship projects.

5. **Task Force SPP.** This flagship project is tasked to revisit and amend UAP vital documents, such as the Architect's National Code, etc. Recently, the UAP National President issued Executive order to strengthen the Task Force SPP and to define its duties and responsibilities.

6. **Task Force UAP National Headquarters.** This flagship project is tasked to continue the development of the UAP National Headquarters.

The major assets of the organization are the UAP National Headquarters located at Scout Rallos Street, Diliman, Quezon City, Metro Manila, which has a current market value of almost P120 Million or US\$2.1 Million, and the 690 square meters commercial land where it stands which has a current market value of P60 million or US\$1.2 Million.

14. FUTURE PLANS AND PROGRAMS

The UAP raises its head to new horizons in the coming years with the full implementation of RA 9266 and the changing environment and more diverse demand for architectural services in the country and the whole world. Thus, its future plans and programs shall be geared toward, viz:

1. Carry on the implementation of the Architecture Act of 2004 with a sustained wave of info-dissemination campaign, stronger alliances with more local government units and national agencies, and foster a high culture excellence in the ranks of UAP officers and members.
2. Adoption of modern world-class Standards for Professional Practice Achievement to raise the ante for architectural services among UAP architects.
3. Completion of the UAP National Headquarters Building.
4. Continued documentation and propagation of "Filipino architecture."

5. Participation of UAP to more international fora and exchanges.
6. Development of a modern, flexible and competitive Philippine architecture at par with their foreign counterparts in an era of boundless international trade and commerce.
