There will be a formal publication ceremony of this book followed by an exhibition at the Bangladesh National Museum on July 16, which will be inaugurated by the Hon. Foreign Minister of Bangladesh. The Honorable Foreign Minister has decided to officially send this Arcasia Heritage Book to all the Bangladesh Missions abroad. Recently IAB delegation met the Honorable Environment Minister to brief him the problem faced by the public regarding approval process of buildings under his ministry. He took immediate some steps in this regard and assured the IAB delegation to look further into the matter. IAB actively takes part in social, cultural & environment movement and files law suits along with other professional bodies to safe guard the environment and heritage of the country. IAB is playing a key role in the updating & revision of the Bangladesh National Building Code and Building Rules of Dhaka City. 	---	<p>We have issues with the requirement of multiple licensing of Architects by various authorities within a city, causing financial strains on the architect, as also the lack of Uniform Building Bye Laws within the same city, etc.</p> <p>In many development authorities, the architect is not given due role and functions that are clearly within an architect's domain. These are being performed by other professionals and as a result, in addition to other disadvantages, job opportunities for architects in government and semi government entities are severely restricted.</p> <p>Because of an engineer dominated environment in the public sector, architectural services are often awarded to engineering firms depriving architects of their legitimate market share.</p> <p>Due to weak regulatory controls, there is a mushroom growth of non-accredited educational institutions offering architectural programs whose graduates find themselves professionally ostracized. .</p>
