MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

The International Union of Architects (UIA)

and

The Architects Regional Council Asia (ARCASIA)

Preamble

Whereas, the International Union of Architects hereinafter called UIA and the Architects Regional Council, Asia hereinafter called ARCASIA, having regard to the long standing cooperation that exists between them and to the expressed intention to further promote this cooperation where mutually agreed and possible;

Whereas, both the UIA President and the Chairman of ARCASIA reaffirmed this intention during the UIA and ARCASIA Meetings in the recent past;

Whereas, the UIA and ARCASIA recognize that a closer co-operation between them will prevent duplication of efforts and result in rationalization of resources;

Whereas, the UIA stands as the Body that represents the architectural profession internationally;

Whereas, the ARCASIA is the Body that represents the architectural profession in ASIA (many of its Member Institutes being recognized sections of UIA also);

Whereas, both Organizations enjoy their own statutes, bylaws, procedures and also their full independence;

Whereas, both Organizations are operating in different contexts and legal frameworks;

Now therefore,

Convinced that, mutual cooperation described in this Memorandum of Understanding will not only help to promote harmonious coordination between the UIA and the ARCASIA but also help prevent duplication of efforts and consolidate resources in addressing mutual concerns and interests pertaining to architecture, architecture education, research, professional development and professional practice among other areas of common endeavours, determined by mutual consent, on a case by case basis;

Furthermore,

Being aware, of the mutual benefit that can result for each of the two Organizations in adopting an approach that allows for the search for mutually beneficial complementarities and synergies that can be effectively pursued;

The two organizations now agree to pursue the following:

1. To rationalize the resources of the two Organizations in pertinent activities at all such levels as mutually agreed;
2. To reinforce the capacity for action of the both Organizations towards third parties where such a co-operation will be of mutual benefit to both organizations;
3. To explore opportunities for joint positions and/or joint actions of both Organizations towards third parties;
4. To co-operate in lobbying activities, if and when appropriate and as mutually agreed;
5. To ensure reciprocal representation at their respective working bodies;
6. To share information of mutual interest.

And, finally,

The two Organizations undertake to establish a closer cooperation between themselves, with the full knowledge and consent of the executive Councils of both Organizations and after their input and agreement, at all levels of proposed co-operation on a case-by-case basis;

Be it known therefore that,

This ***Memorandum of Understanding*** is effective when ratified by the Councils of each Organization, for a period of five years from the date of signature and can be continued, revised or discontinued, by mutual agreement at the end of that period.

- It was decided during the last Council Meeting in Nepal, 2013 that the MOU with AIA shall end at the end of 2014 (end of President Pei Ing's term) and no further MOU shall be signed with AIA.
- Met up with Ar. Helene Combs Dreiling, who was the then AIA President-Elect and conveyed the decision and sentiment of Council to her. We agreed that ARCASIA and AIA would continue with close collaboration and information sharing.
- AIA still invited President of ARCASIA to attend the AIA Convention 2014 in Chicago. However, the dates of the Convention clashes with ACA16.

V4AF (Vicegrad Four Architecture Foundation)

- *The contact with Visegrad Four Architects (VFA) was first initiated by Ar. Xu Zongwei, Vice President of Zone C and a couple of discussions were held between ASC and the President and delegates of VF4 to explore collaboration with ARCASIA. This was reported during the last Council Meeting in Nepal.*
- *Met up with the President of VFA, Ar. Kalman Erno in February 2014 and he expressed great interest in collaborating with ARCASIA. Close communication has been established since.*
- *ARCASIA was invited to VFA's Hudec Memorial Meeting on 21st February 2014.*
- *VFA offers to host an ARCASIA exhibition to coincide with their next event, the Architect Adria regatta in August, and also in October, the month of architecture in Budapest. The proposed venue is the Danube Palace, or the Technical University OF Budapest.*
- *VFAF has also sent the proposed draft of the MOU which will be tabled for discussion and decision.*



- *The Organisation of Visegrad Four Architects (VFA) is the predecessor to Visegrad Four Architectural Foundation, was established as a regional and independent organization in 2008 by:-*
 - *The presidents of 4 national architectural associations (Oleg Haman from the Czech Republic, Jerzy Grochulsky from Poland, Stefan Slachta from Slovakia and Kalman Erno from Hungary).*
 - *Its founding memorandum was signed in the presence of Gaétan Siew, the president, and Martin Drahovsky, the vice-president of UIA then in being, as well as Daniel Liebeskind, Henning Larsen and Tuomo Siitonen.*
- *The VFA has been active among architectural associations within the Central-East European geo-political region. Recently, VFA decided to change the organizational framework from cooperation to foundation. A foundation could support the enhancement of their activity inside UIA as well as the regional associations, according to the aims setup in the proposed memorandum.*

- *VFA fully acknowledge the importance of establishing relationship with the Asian region and has established close cooperation with ASC. Both the 2013 Shanghai memorial exhibition of László Hudecz, and the Hudecz Conference this year were supported ASC.*
- *VFA also recognises the important to finance book editions, to maintain and encourage the attention towards sacred architecture, and to define common architectural agendas for the future.*
- *Their general assemblies and events take place yearly in the framework of UIA, usually on the World Architecture Day.*

- *If ARCASIA approves the proposal to establish cooperation with VFA, VFA suggested to sign the MOU between ARCASIA and Visegrad Four Architectural Foundation (V4AF) either in KL after the Council meeting or later part of the year, coinciding with other events such as the UIA Congress in August, 2014.*

- *In view that V4AF is still pending formal registration, in order to give ARCASIA the assurance on the foundation, VFA suggested the following to be added to the preamble of the MOU between ARCASIA and V4AF:*
 - *“The founders hereby affirm that they establish Visegrad Four Architectural Foundation (V4AF), which is currently under registration. The present document is signed in accordance with the founders’ will.”*

LIKEWISE, the **V4AF** states hereby that the **ARCASIA** is invited to represent Asian architecture as exhibitor of high priority on the occasion of the World Day of Architecture in the autumn of 2014 and also organizes a conference with the participation of **ARCASIA**;

FURTHER MORE, the two Parties announce their cooperation informing the architects all over the world at the UIA XXV Durban Congress in august 2014 as well as support each other mutually in order to advance the election of their candidates.

THE TWO ORGANIZATIONS NOW AGREED THE FOLLOWING;

- 1) To rationalize the resources of the Parties in pertinent activities at all levels;
 - 2) To reinforce the capacity for action of the Parties; To explore opportunities for joint positions and / or joint actions of the Parties;
 - 3) To cooperate in lobbying activities, if and when appropriate.
 - 4) To ensure reciprocal representation at their respective working bodies
 - 5) To share information of mutual interest
- AND THAT FINALLY the Parties undertake to establish a closer cooperation between them at political, technical and working levels and that both will strike out details of this cooperation.
 - This MOU shall be valid until recall.
