REPROPOSE GENERAL TERMS OF AWARDS/ GRANT

Theme

- Socially-related architectural or environmental topics, projects, or programmes to be proposed by applicants

Award/ Grant

- US\$8,000.00 per Award for a 10-year period (next five ARCASIA ACAs) (inclusive of US\$1,000.00 allowance for attendance at Award Presentations, such as airfares, accommodation, local travel, etc.)

* depends on organizer arrangement

Applications

- Online applications and submissions to be sent directly to ARCASIA or **selected secreteriat**
- Applicants to inform their respective local Institute of Architects

Eligible Applicants

- Architectural students and graduates (age limit - ~~30~~ **40** years old **according to young Architect cap age**)
- Individuals or Teams (Team Leader must be nominated)

Jury Panel

- Jury panel to consist of five (5) members as follow:
 - ARCASIA President (Jury Chairperson)
 - Vice President or their Representative from Zone A, B and C
 - **ACYA or ACAE Chairman's if necessary**
 - Donor Representative (member of Barry Will family)

Schedule

- January - Promotion and Application of Award (via ARCASIA website **or other web systems**)
- April - Receive Submissions of Proposals by ARCASIA
- June - Jury Meeting and Selection of Winner (actual or online)

Award Presentation to Winner during ARCASIA Student Jamboree at each ACA **or other suitable events or portals** (announcement via ARCASIA website)

POTENTIAL AWARDS/ GRANTS OPEN CALL

BIG IDEA, SMALL EXECUTION

- Submission of big idea proposals related to social and sustainability
- How the seed fund can help the start of the project

Output : Design ideas + Estimates

Benefit: Choice of innovative ideas

Disadvantage: Success is subjective, delayed outcome

ONGOING INITIATIVES

- Submission of ongoing initiatives related to social sustainability
- Innovative new idea to improve
- How the seed fund can help the social works

Output : Design ideas + Estimates

Benefits: On ground execution + Team established+ Fast outcome

Disadvantage: small ideas.

THE GLOBAL GOALS For Sustainable Development



Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) (or Global Goals for Sustainable Development, the 17 Global Goals, the Global Goals or simply the Goals) are a collection of 17 global goals set by the United Nations General Assembly in 2015. The SDGs are part of Resolution 70/1 of the United Nations General Assembly: "Transforming our World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development." That has been shortened to "2030 Agenda." The goals are broad and interdependent, yet each has a separate list of targets to achieve. Achieving all 169 targets would signal accomplishing all 17 goals. The SDGs cover social and economic development issues including poverty, hunger, health, education, global warming, gender equality, water, sanitation, energy, urbanization, environment and social justice.

7 Point Evaluation



Project Sustainability

How has the submission demonstrated social, economic or environmental impact, in-turn contributing in creating a sustainable community



Project Innovation

Demonstrating a fresh and unique approach towards a challenge resulting in an innovative solution that is a first of its kind in PJ



Project Methodology

How well defined in the process by which the project is conceived and developed up to the point of execution and in its monitoring and assessment



Depth of Collaboration

Demonstrates the degree by which the community and various stakeholders of the project were involved in the evolution of the project



Project Scaleability

The degree to which the project is easily scaleable and duplicated so that multiple communities will be able to benefit from the project



Project Impact

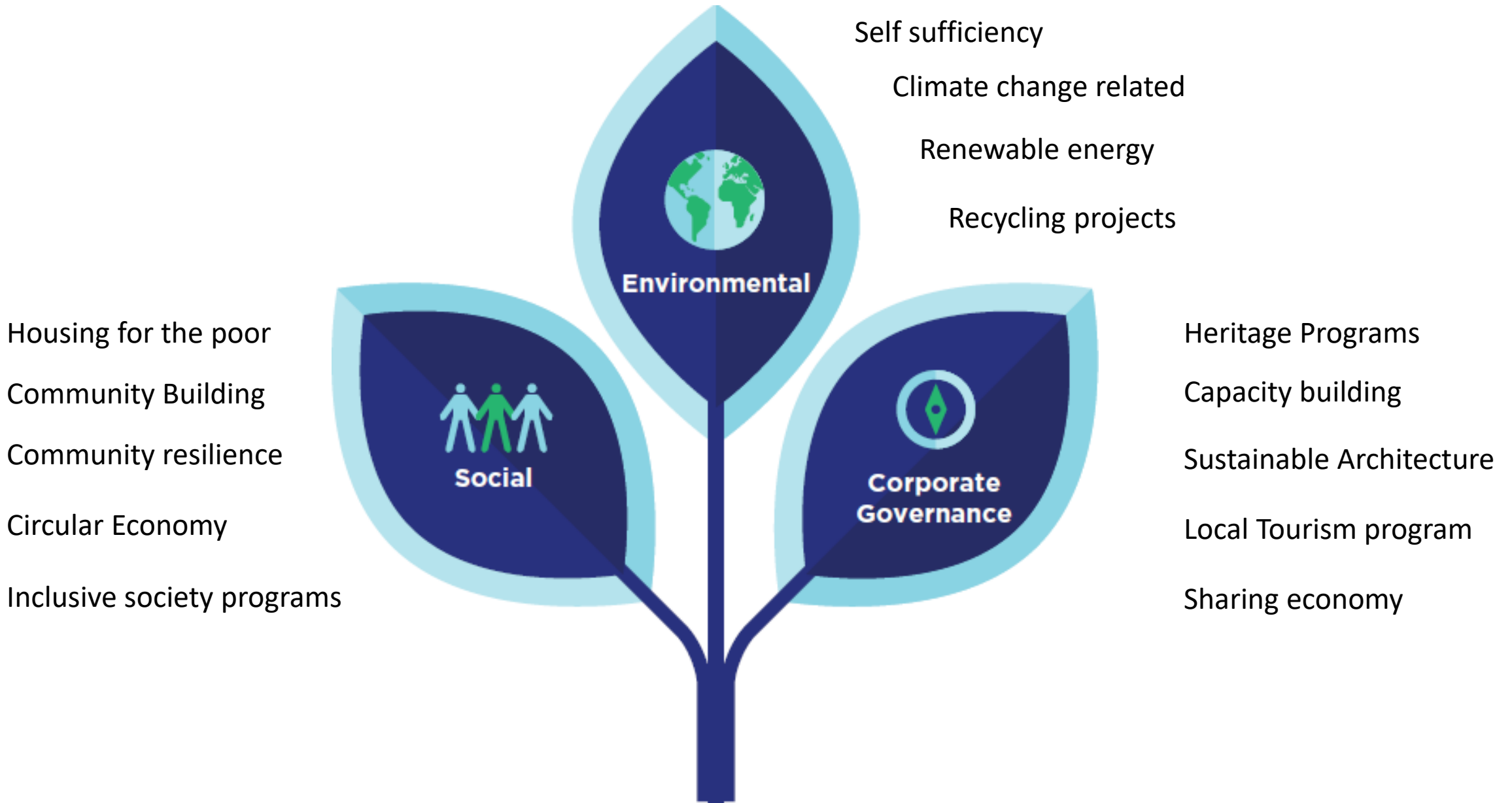
To what extent is the project able to have a positive impact towards the challenge and if it is able to demonstrate its feasibility in addressing the challenge



Presentation Quality

How well has the project team been able to communicate and present with clarity about the project or initiative to the satisfaction of the judges

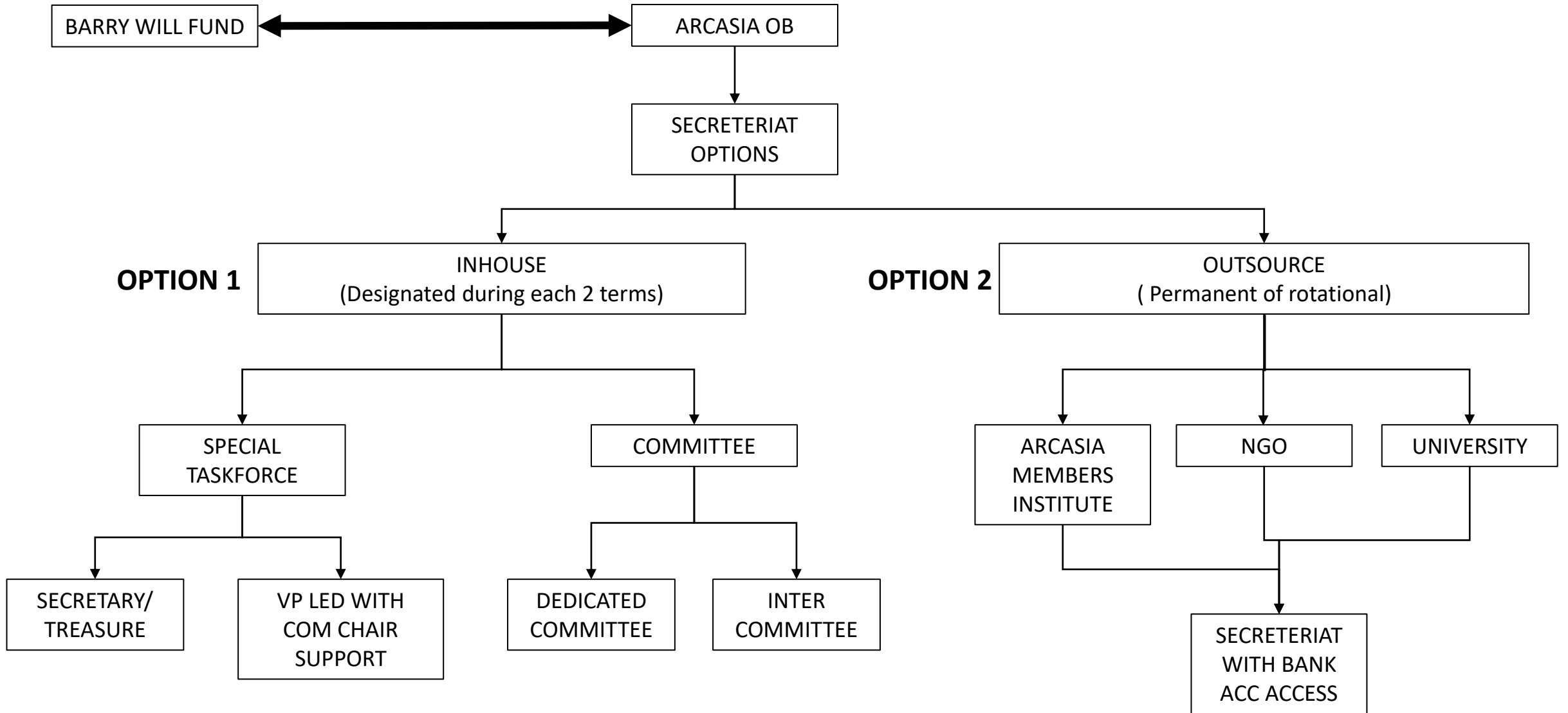

INITIAL SETUP ADMIN & SYSTEM COST – USD 5,000

Remaining budget = USD 40,000-5,000 = USD 35,000

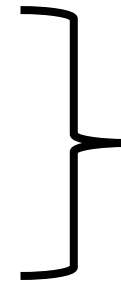
Available running budget per cycle:

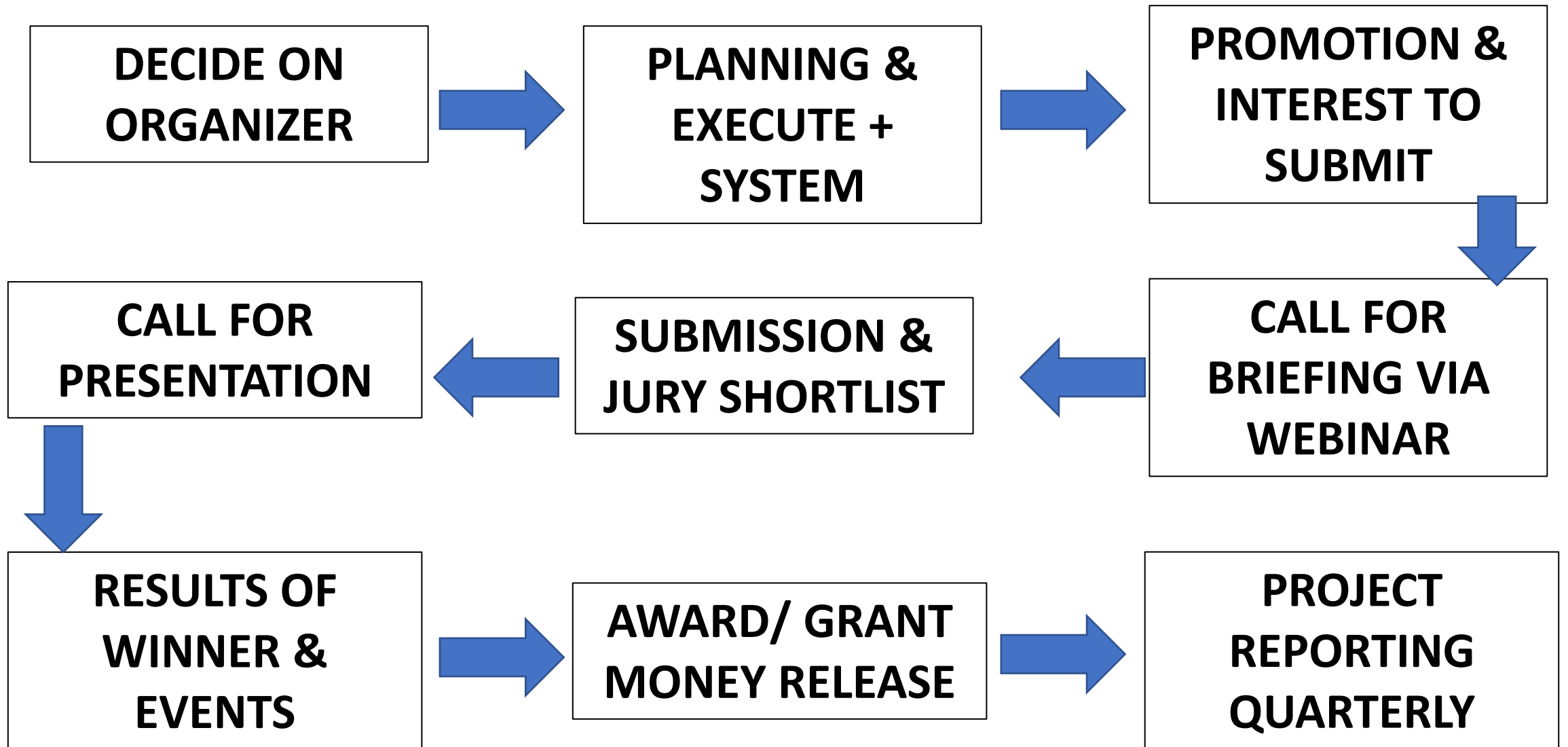
