

The ARCASIA Student Jamboree Manual

(Compiled by Syed Akeel Bilgrami(IAP) on behalf of ACAE)

Responsibility

- Hosting Institute shall be solely responsible for local hospitality for the student delegates during the Jamboree.

Theme and Details

- The theme and details shall be presented for consensus at the ACAE meeting held one year prior to the event.

Student Delegates (2 from each Member Country)

- To be provided free registration, local hospitality, including food and board.
- To bear the cost of travel to and from the venue of the Jamboree.

Student Observers

- To be provided facilities for a minimum of 10 Student Observers from each member country.
- To pay all necessary charges for attending the Jamboree event, including travel registration fee, food and board.
- (Student Observers must be screened and approved by each institute to be added).
- (Student Observer has equal status to student delegates).

3. Student Jamboree Manual

The ARCASIA Student Jamboree Manual

(Compiled by Syed Akeel Bilgrami(IAP) on behalf of ACAE)

Jamboree Program

- A one day student's seminar or workshop.
- Attending both days of the Asian Congress of Architects
- Attending at least one social function in the evenings.
- A one session meeting of the Official Student Delegates for Architectural Education (ACAE) to feedback and communication.

Timing

- Theme -1 year prior to the event.
- Preliminary notice of registration fee - 3 months prior to the event.
- Confirmation of number of official student delegates and observers - 2 months prior.

Feedback from Delegates & Observers

- Forms to be filled up by the student delegates to get a feedback.

3. Student Jamboree Manual

(Draft for consideration)

The ARCASIA Student Jamboree Manual (Compiled by Syed Akeel Bilgrami (IAP) on behalf of ACAE)

1.0 Overview

1.1 Accompanying each Asian Congress of Architects is the gathering of architectural students from member countries of ARCASIA under the auspices of the ARCASIA Committee for Architectural Education (ACAE).

1.2 The objectives of the ARCASIA Student Jamboree are as follows:

- 1.2.1 To facilitate talented Asian students of architecture to travel in the region and experience the architecture of different, but related environments from their own.
- 1.2.2 To foster among the up-and-coming generation of architects in the region a better understanding of each other's countries and their contemporary conditions and problems.
- 1.2.3 To encourage the building of interpersonal contacts between the architectural students in the region.
- 1.2.4 To promote awareness among the Asian architectural students of the role and work of ARCASIA and ACAE and to engender their support to and future participation as architects in these institutions.
- 1.2.5 To enliven ARCASIA gatherings by the presence of students.

2.0 Responsibility

- 2.1 The Member Institute hosting the Asian Congress of architects shall be solely responsible for the hosting and organizing of the ARCASIA Students Jamboree and for providing local hospitality for the student delegates for the duration of the Jamboree.
- 2.2 The person responsible for the organizing of the event from the Host Member Institute shall be their respective ACAE representative.

3.0 Theme and Details

3.1 The theme and details of the Student Jamboree shall be presented for the deliberation and consensus at the ACAE meeting held one year prior to the event by the ACAE representative of the Host Member Institute.

4.0 Notice of Event

4.1 The Host Member Institute shall, at least six (6) months prior to the event, send a notice to each Member Institute giving preliminary details of the event including the dates of the event and request for the nomination of two (2) Official Student Delegates from each Member Institute. It is preferable at this time to outline the policy on students attending the Jamboree as Observers.

4.2 At least three (3) months prior to the event, the Host Member Institute shall send the final details, including the program and registration form, to all Member Institutes and student delegates, if already nominated. **(Suggested Registration Forms for foreign students and local students are attached as Annexure-01 and Annexure-02)**

5.0 Student Delegates

- 5.1 Each member Institute shall select using their own criteria, two (2) official Student Delegates for whom the Host Member Institute shall provide free registration, local hospitality, including food and board, for the duration of the Jamboree. The Member Institute or the official Student Delegates themselves shall bear the cost of travel to and from the venue of the Jamboree.
- 5.2 In addition to the Official Student Delegates, the Host Member Institute shall provide facilities for a minimum of 10 Student Observers from each member country, who shall pay all necessary charges for attending the Jamboree event, including travel, registration fee, food and board. The Host Member Institute may at its discretion increase the foreign student participation.
- 5.3 The Host Member Institute shall fix the registration fee and strength of student participation from each country and announce it in the preliminary notices at least three months prior to the event. This is to enable more students from member countries to participate in the Jamboree without being a financial burden to the Host Member Institute.
- 5.4 The Host Member Institute shall be free to encourage as many local students from the Host Country to participate in the Jamboree, as deemed fit by them. They shall also be free to fix the registration fee and other charges, if any, for local student's attendance.
- 5.5 The Member Institutes shall confirm to the Host Member Institute at least two (2) months prior to the event, of the number of Official Student Delegates and Student Observers who shall be attending.

6.0 Finance

- 6.1 The Host Member Institute shall:
 - 6.1.1 Bear all expenses associated with the hosting the Jamboree and local hospitality expenses for all official student delegates from Member countries.
 - 6.1.2 Obtain sponsorships or grants
 - 6.1.3 Jointly host the event with the local school(s) of architecture

7.0 Organizing Committee

- 7.1 The Host Member Institute shall have an Organizing Committee and relevant sub-committees appointed for the purpose of organizing the Jamboree.
- 7.2 The Chairman of this Committee, who shall be the Convenor of the Jamboree, should preferably be the current ACAE Representative of the Host Member Institute or a past ACAE representative.

3. Student Jamboree Manual

8.0 Venue for the Jamboree

8.1 It is preferable to host the Jamboree in one of the local schools of architecture of the Host Member country, in the same city as the venue for the Asian Congress of Architects (ACA) and ARCASIA Council Meetings.

8.2 This brings the local students into contact with the foreign Jamboree participants and livens up the event.

8.3 Moreover, the facilities of the local university could be used by the Host Member Institute without having to resort to hiring a venue. It would be permissible for the local school of architecture to also co-sponsor the Jamboree and share the costs and provide facilities.

9.0 Accommodation

9.1 Accommodation for student delegates shall be provided in student hostels. If there are rooms, it shall be on twin sharing basis. Otherwise, a dormitory type accommodation shall be provided. It is preferable to locate within walking distance the accommodation and the venue for the Jamboree.

10.0 Jamboree Program

10.1 The program shall include the following:

10.1.1 A one day student's seminar or workshop on a theme proposed by the Host Member Institute and agreed by ACAE. This is to provide an opportunity for intellectual interaction. **(Sample of Workshop Handout is attached as Annexure 03)**

10.1.2 Attending both days of the Asian Congress of Architects which should be dovetailed in the Jamboree program, to give an opportunity for the student delegates and observers to benefit from the architects' presentations.

10.1.3 Attending at least one social function in the evenings, preferably the Friendship Night, to interact with the other delegates to the ARCASIA Council Meetings and Congress.

10.1.4 If possible, a one session meeting of the Official Student Delegates with the ARCASIA Committee for Architectural Education (ACAE) to provide an opportunity for feedback and communication between the students and ACAE members on matters relating to Architectural Education.

10.1.5 A one day tour of the City or the countryside..

11.0 Food

11.1 Reasonable quality food shall be provided for student delegates and observers. Care should be taken to request student delegates for any diet restrictions through registration forms.

12.0 Local Student Guides

12.1 Student delegates attending a Jamboree may be traveling to the Host Member country for the first time and may be unfamiliar with many things. It would help to provide them upon arrival, a handout about the currency, local customs, do's and don'ts, a neighborhood map, etc...

12.2 The Host Member Institute through the local school(s) of architecture may assign two or three local students, who are also Jamboree participants, to student delegates and observers from each country, for guidance and assistance.

12.3 The local students would be responsible to assist the foreign students from the time of pick-up at the airport until departure, including guidance on personal requests like shopping, etc. This arrangement will not only assist the foreign students but also build stronger bonds amongst the students present at the Jamboree.

13.0 Transport to and from the Airport

13.1 The local Host Member Institute should make arrangements for transfer to and from the Airport for all official student delegates. For student observers, a reasonable charge for this may be levied. This is to avoid students traveling along in unfamiliar circumstances.

14.0 Visa and Travel Advise

14.1 In the preliminary announcement, advice shall be given by the Host Member Institute on travel and visa requirements including advice on the climate at the time of the Jamboree.

15.0 National/Traditional Dress

15.1 Students should be encouraged to bring along their national/traditional dress to be used at the opening ceremony.

16.0 Exhibition of Student Works

16.1 It is advisable to hold an exhibition of student works. The majority of work exhibited shall be from local schools of architecture with the foreign students being requested to bring along samples of works from their own countries to be exhibited for the duration of the Jamboree. This is to give an opportunity for students and other Architects present at this function to view the work of local schools of architecture and compare the works of students from different countries.

17.0 Group Photographs

17.1 An official group photograph is to be taken together with all official student delegates for record purposes.

18.0 Feedback from Delegates

18.1 After the Jamboree the Host Member Institute should distribute forms to be filled up by the student delegates to get a feedback on the Jamboree for purposes of assisting in the planning of future Jamborees, and return to their own Institutes.

19.0 Report on Jamboree

19.1 The Host Member Institute through their ACAE representative should submit a report on the Jamboree held, together with the feedback received, at the subsequent ACAE Meeting, held a year later. This report is to document for record purposes, and to assist in the planning of future Jamborees.

20.0 ARCASIA Student Design Competition

20.1 An ARCASIA Student Design Competition shall be organized by the Host Country on behalf of ACAE as an independent activity that will culminate at the ARCASIA Student Jamboree. The Competition will be a one stage competition open to architectural students from Member Countries of ARCASIA through their Member Institute.

20.2 The theme of the competition shall be decided at the ACAE Meeting one year prior to the hosting of the Jamboree.

20.6 The Jury to assess the designs shall consist of five members, viz., the Chairman of ACAE, the three Vice Presidents of ARCASIA representing the three zones and the Convenor of the Student Jamboree. In the absence of any of the above, the Host Institute shall nominate one or more reputable architects as replacement(s). The jury shall deliberate at least one day prior to the inauguration of the Jamboree.

20.7 The three best entries shall be selected by the Jury. The first prize awarded by the Jury shall be called the ARCASIA Student Prize which will be a gold medal paid for by ARCASIA. The Host Institute shall announce suitable cash prizes to the second and third prize winners. All three shall also receive certificates signed by the Chairman ACAE and Convenor of the ARCASIA Student Competition.

21.0 Exhibition of ARCASIA Student Design Competition Entries

Brief history

The Association of Siamese Architects (ASA)

ASA was established in 1933 with two fundamental objectives: to promote the architectural profession and to encourage sharing and exchanging information among members. To facilitate its operations, the organizational structure, as well as the bylaws, were simple.

Inactive during World War II, ASA revived in 1945. Though the Kingdom's name had changed to "Thailand", ASA retained its original name as a way of preserving a link to the founding principles.

From 1947, ASA concentrated on building an organization that served both the profession and society. Activities addressed the following areas:

- Professional practices
- Professional standards
- Professional ethics
- Code of conduct
- Cooperation among members in pursuing shared goals
- Promotion architectural research
- Professional advocacy
-

In 1954, ASA came under the Royal Patronage of His Majesty King Bhumipol Adulyadej.

ASA Objectives

- Promote the continuing enhancement of the architecture profession in ways that are friendly to the environment and that preserve Thai traditions, while maintaining professional independence.
- Promote harmony and unity among members to enhance the stature and efficacy of ASA with a common focus on activities that benefit the profession and society.
- Serve as a resource for professional and technical information and advice for the benefit of members and society.
- To encourage, support, and promote education, research, and development that ensures the field of architecture progresses with the times.
- Cooperate with government agencies, as well as domestic and international organizations and institutions, to create and understanding and appreciation of the principles, role, and scope of the architecture profession as a means for fostering credibility and trust.
- Promote, develop, and perform the architecture profession in accordance with the highest standards of service and ethics for the benefit of members and the public.
- Define and certify the standards and rules for the practice of architecture.

The Architect council of Thailand (ACT)

In December 1965, a law administered by the Ministry of Interior came into effect requiring that architects be licensed to practice the profession. To oversee the licensing and monitoring process, the law established the Thai Architects Professional Practices Board (TAPPB) with 2 of 13 members from the ASA.

In 2000, reflecting the evolution of the design professions in Thailand. The Architect Council of Thailand (ACT) was formed and encompasses four main design disciplines: architecture, interior design, landscape architecture, and urban. Members of the Board are formed by election every 4 years. The current president is Admiral Thanit Kittiampon. His period will end in 2010.

The Architect Council of Thailand (ACT) who is the regulator and controller of professional practice in Thailand has been developing CPD program for Thai Architects to help ensure that qualified professional maintain their competence as internationally practice. This drafting of regulation for this program is now underway and will hopefully be enacted early 2009.

ACT objectives ;

- To promote education, research, practicing, harmony, conciliation, and welfare of architectural members.
- To purport to control the behavior of architects.
- To support and give advice to both its members and other organizations relating to architectural science.

Council of Deans of Architectural School of Thailand (CDAST)

In relation to architectural education, the establishment of Dean Council was conceived in 1994. At that time only 6 schools of architecture existed. The first national architectural school seminar in 1996 indicated the necessary of the establishment of Dean Council. Not until 2003 that the establishment of Council of Deans of Architectural School of Thailand (CDAST) was completed. Every year, each university takes turn to chair the council. Currently, Rajamangala University of Technology Thanyaburi is the chair. At present there are 21 members in CDAST.

CDAST objectives ;

- To promote unity and seek cooperation among architectural schools including three other disciplines i.e., landscape, interior and urban planning.
- To be a center of architectural academic activities.
- To cooperate with other organizations on architectural research and development that benefit the architectural practice and society.

In summary, ASA works to improve professional practice to its members by organizing training courses, seminars, developing professional handbooks and standards. ACT, the only organization among the three, is established by the government to ensure the quality of architects whose works are directly related to public safety. ACT is responsible for licensing of architect and accreditation of architectural schools. CDAST was established to focus on architectural education. The three organizations, i.e., ASA, ACT and CDAST loosely form a triangular relationship. This enables them to work toward the common goal which is to enhance architectural education and practice to the highest standard for the benefit of society and their members.

- b. Knowledge of construction procurement methods, tender procedures.
- c. Project planning documentation and execution.
- d. Site organization and the establishment of appropriate lines of communication.
- e. Knowledge of value engineering.
- f. Risk management and insurance related to construction.
- g. Assess and organize quality control during construction.
- h. Knowledge of methods of dispute resolution.

3. OFFICE MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

- a. Knowledge on protection of intellectual property and copyright.
- b. Techniques of marketing of professional services.
- c. Knowledge on professional negligence and indemnity.
- d. Knowledge of taxation, employment laws and business administration.
- e. Knowledge of human resource management and information technology related to providing professional services.
- f. Knowledge of appropriate financial models relevant to professional practices.
- g. Knowledge of national and international trends in procurement and commissioning of architectural services.

3. The Host Institute to recommend minimum remuneration for the students sent by the Participant Institute based on the Host Country prevailing wages etc.
4. As far as possible to arrange the required training as requested by the Participant Institute.
5. To appoint counselors to monitor the progress of training of the participant students.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARTICIPANT INSTITUTE

1. To examine the recommend qualifications of the participant students that they have achieved a level of academic qualifications to receive practical training as required.
2. To recommend the ability of participant students by way of test that the participant students will be useful to the practices of the Host Institute at which the student will obtain training.
3. To take responsibility that the participant students will return to his country of origin after completion of training period.

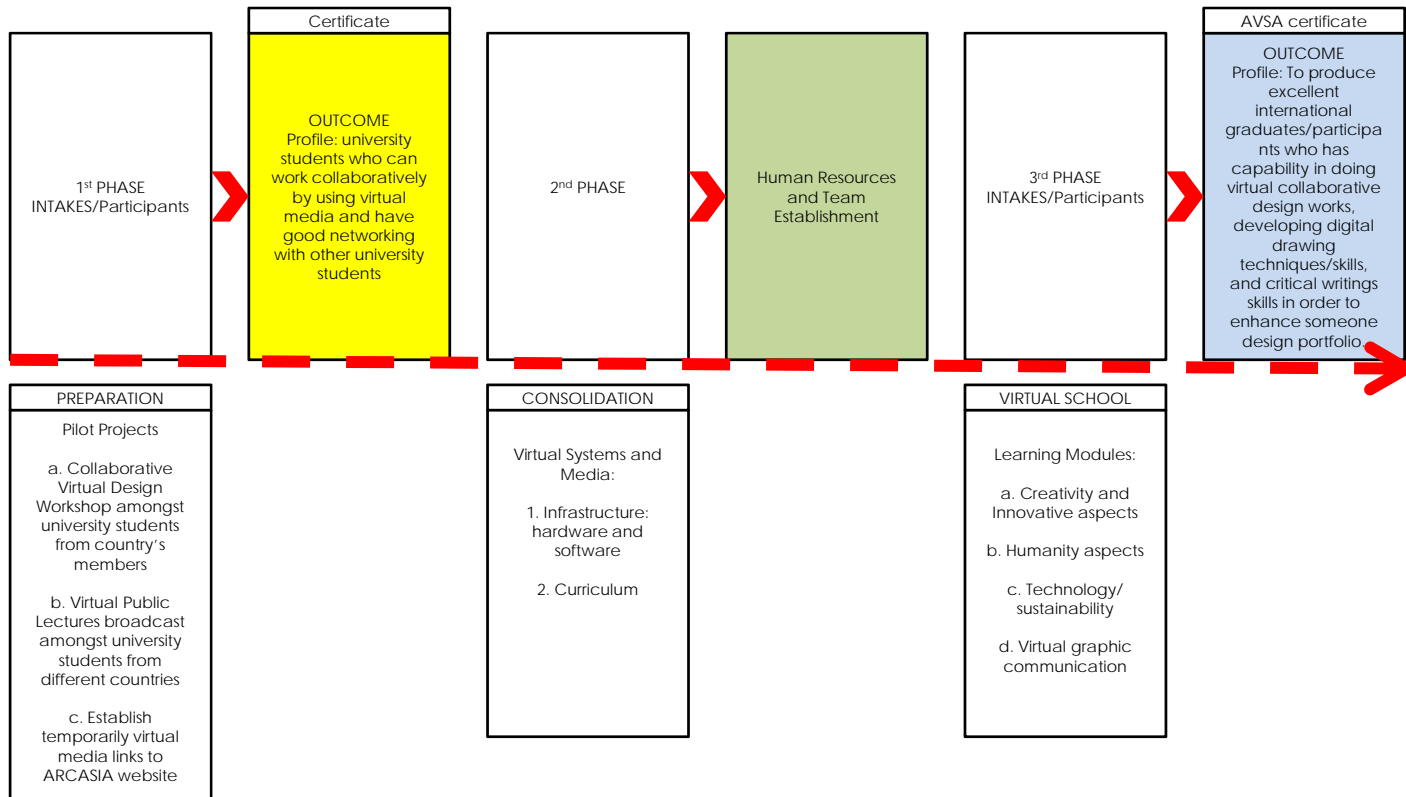

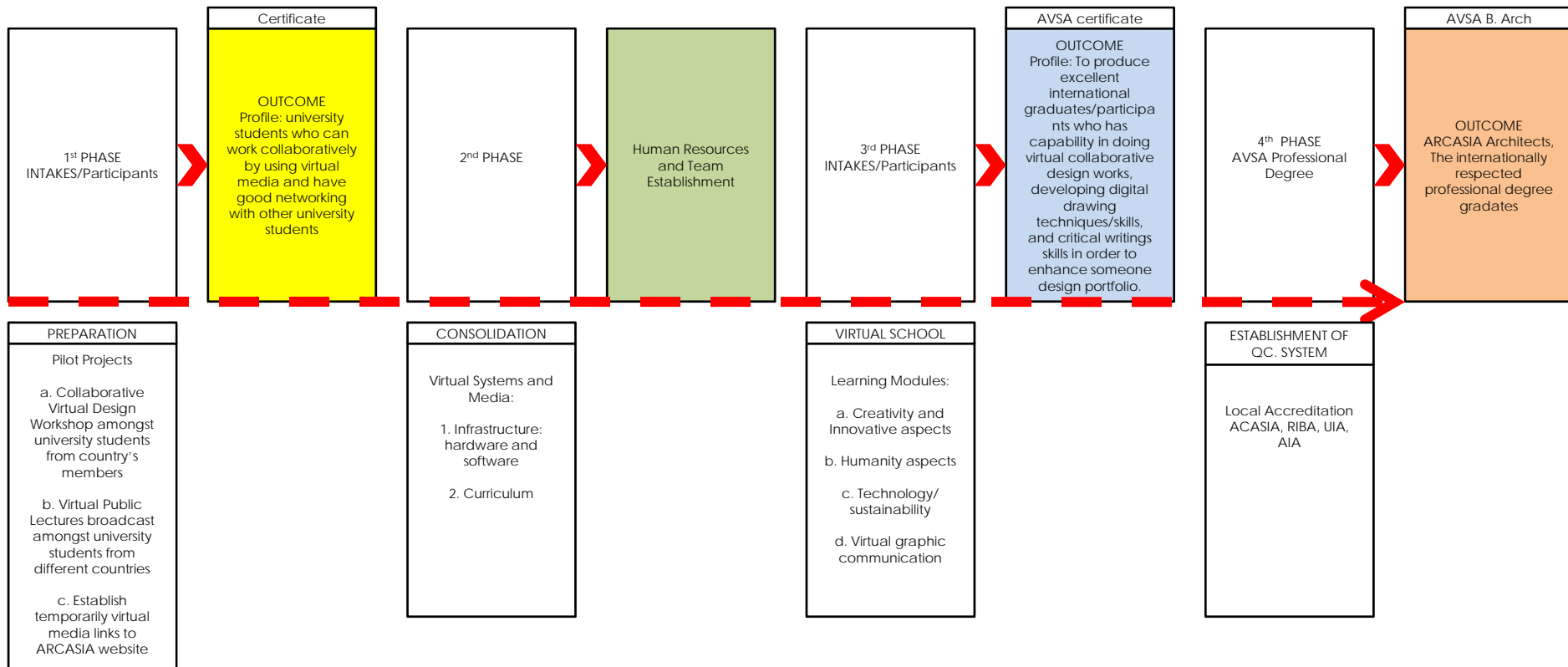
