### **The ARCASIA Student Jamboree Manual (Compiled by Syed Akeel Bilgrami (IAP) on behalf of ACAE)**

#### **1.0 Overview**

1.1 Accompanying each Asian Congress of Architects is the gathering of architectural students from member countries of ARCASIA under the auspices of the ARCASIA Committee for Architectural Education (ACAE).

1.2 The objectives of the ARCASIA Student Jamboree are as follows:

1.2.1 To facilitate talented Asian students of architecture to travel in the region and experience the architecture of different, but related environments from their own.

1.2.2 To foster among the up-and-coming generation of architects in the region a better understanding of each other's countries and their contemporary conditions and problems.

1.2.3 To encourage the building of interpersonal contacts between the architectural students in the region.

1.2.4 To promote awareness among the Asian architectural students of the role and work of ARCASIA and ACAE and to engender their support to and future participation as architects in these institutions.

1.2.5 To enliven ARCASIA gatherings by the presence of students.

#### **2.0 Responsibility**

2.1 The Member Institute hosting the Asian Congress of architects shall be solely responsible for the hosting and organizing of the ARCASIA Students Jamboree and for providing local hospitality for the student delegates for the duration of the Jamboree.

2.2 The person responsible for the organizing of the event from the Host Member Institute shall be their respective ACAE representative.

#### **3.0 Theme and Details**

3.1 The theme and details of the Student Jamboree shall be presented for the deliberation and consensus at the ACAE meeting held one year prior to the event by the ACAE representative of the Host Member Institute.

#### **4.0 Notice of Event**

4.1 The Host Member Institute shall, at least six (6) months prior to the event, send a notice to each Member Institute giving preliminary details of the event including the dates of the event and request for the nomination of two (2) Official Student Delegates from each Member Institute. It is preferable at this time to outline the policy on students attending the Jamboree as Observers.

4.2 At least three (3) months prior to the event, the Host Member Institute shall send the final details, including the program and registration form, to all Member Institutes and student delegates, if already nominated. **(Suggested Registration Forms for foreign students and local students are attached as Annexure-01 and Annexue-02)**

## **5.0 Student Delegates**

5.1 Each member Institute shall select using their own criteria, two (2) official Student Delegates for whom the Host Member Institute shall provide free registration, local hospitality, including food and board, for the duration of the Jamboree. The Member Institute *or* the official Student Delegates themselves shall bear the cost of travel to and from the venue of the Jamboree.

5.2 In addition to the Official Student Delegates, the Host Member Institute shall provide facilities for a minimum of 10 Student Observers from each member country, who shall pay all necessary charges for attending the Jamboree event, including travel, registration fee, food and board. The Host Member Institute may at its discretion increase the foreign student participation.

5.3 The Host Member Institute shall fix the registration fee and strength of student participation from each country and announce it in the preliminary notices at least three months prior to the event. This is to enable more students from member countries to participate in the Jamboree without being a financial burden to the Host Member Institute.

5.4 The Host Member Institute shall be free to encourage as many local students from the Host Country to participate in the Jamboree, as deemed fit by them. They shall also be free to fix the registration fee and other charges, if any, for local student's attendance.

5.5 The Member Institutes shall confirm to the Host Member Institute at least two (2) months prior to the event, of the number of Official Student Delegates and Student Observers who shall be attending.

## **6.0 Finance**

6.1 The Host Member Institute shall:

6.1.1 Bear all expenses associated with the hosting the Jamboree and local hospitality expenses for all official student delegates from Member countries.

6.1.2 Obtain sponsorships or grants

6.1.3 Jointly host the event with the local school(s) of architecture

## **7.0 Organizing Committee**

7.1 The Host Member Institute shall have an Organizing Committee and relevant sub-committees appointed for the purpose of organizing the Jamboree.

7.2 The Chairman of this Committee, who shall be the Convenor of the Jamboree, should preferably be the current ACAE Representative of the Host Member Institute or a past ACAE representative.

## **8.0 Venue for the Jamboree**

8.1 It is preferable to host the Jamboree in one of the local schools of architecture of the Host Member country, in the same city as the venue for the Asian Congress of Architects (ACA) and ARCASIA Council Meetings.

8.2 This brings the local students into contact with the foreign Jamboree participants and livens up the event.

8.3 Moreover, the facilities of the local university could be used by the Host Member Institute without having to resort to hiring a venue. It would be permissible for the local school of architecture to also co-sponsor the Jamboree and share the costs and provide facilities.

## **9.0 Accommodation**

9.1 Accommodation for student delegates shall be provided in student hostels. If there are rooms, it shall be on twin sharing basis. Otherwise, a dormitory type accommodation shall be provided. It is preferable to locate within walking distance the accommodation and the venue for the Jamboree.

## **10.0 Jamboree Program**

10.1 The program shall include the following:

10.1.1 A one day student's seminar or workshop on a theme proposed by the Host Member Institute and agreed by ACAE. This is to provide an opportunity for intellectual interaction. **(Sample of Workshop Handout is attached as Annexure 03)**

10.1.2 Attending both days of the Asian Congress of Architects which should be dovetailed in the Jamboree program, to give an opportunity for the student delegates and observers to benefit from the architects' presentations.

10.1.3 Attending at least one social function in the evenings, preferably the Friendship Night, to interact with the other delegates to the ARCASIA Council Meetings and Congress.

10.1.4 If possible, a one session meeting of the Official Student Delegates with the ARCASIA Committee for Architectural Education (ACAE) to provide an opportunity for feedback and communication between the students and ACAE members on matters relating to Architectural Education.

10.1.5 A one day tour of the City or the countryside..

## **11.0 Food**

11.1 Reasonable quality food shall be provided for student delegates and observers. Care should be taken to request student delegates for any diet restrictions through registration forms.

## **12.0 Local Student Guides**

12.1 Student delegates attending a Jamboree may be traveling to the Host Member country for the first time and may be unfamiliar with many things. It would help to provide them upon arrival, a handout about the currency, local customs, do's and don'ts, a neighborhood map, etc.,.

12.2 The Host Member Institute through the local school(s) of architecture may assign two or three local students, who are also Jamboree participants, to student delegates and observers from each country, for guidance and assistance.

12.3 The local students would be responsible to assist the foreign students from the time of pick-up at the airport until departure, including guidance on personal requests like shopping, etc. This arrangement will not only assist the foreign students but also build stronger bonds amongst the students present at the Jamboree.

### **13.0 Transport to and from the Airport**

13.1 The local Host Member Institute should make arrangements for transfer to and from the Airport for all official student delegates. For student observers, a reasonable charge for this may be levied. This is to avoid students traveling along in unfamiliar circumstances.

### **14.0 Visa and Travel Advise**

14.1 In the preliminary announcement, advice shall be given by the Host Member Institute on travel and visa requirements including advice on the climate at the time of the Jamboree.

### **15.0 National/Traditional Dress**

15.1 Students should be encouraged to bring along their national/traditional dress to be used at the opening ceremony.

### **16.0 Exhibition of Student Works**

16.1 It is advisable to hold an exhibition of student works. The majority of work exhibited shall be from local schools of architecture with the foreign students being requested to bring along samples of works from their own countries to be exhibited for the duration of the Jamboree. This is to give an opportunity for students and other Architects present at this function to view the work of local schools of architecture and compare the works of students from difference countries.

### **17.0 Group Photographs**

17.1 An official group photographs is to be taken together with all official student delegates for record purposes.

### **18.0 Feedback from Delegates**

18.1 After the Jamboree the Host Member Institute should distribute forms to be filled up by the student delegates to get a feedback on the Jamboree for purposes of assisting in the planning of future Jamborees, and return to their own Institutes.

### **19.0 Report on Jamboree**

19.1 The Host Member Institute through their ACAE representative should submit a report on the Jamboree held, together with the feedback received, at the subsequent ACAE Meeting, held a year later. This report is to document for record purposes, and to assist in the planning of future Jamborees.

### **20.0 ARCASIA Student Design Competition**

**(Sample Format of the competition document is attached as Annexure 04)**

20.1 An ARCASIA Student Design Competition shall be organized by the Host Country on behalf of ACAE as an independent activity that will culminate at the ARCASIA Student Jamboree. The Competition will be a one stage competition open to architectural students from Member Countries of ARCASIA through their Member Institute.

20.2 The theme of the competition shall be decided at the ACAE Meeting one year prior to the hosting of the Jamboree.

20.3 The ACAE Representative of the Host Country shall be the Convenor responsible for the organization of the competition.

20.4 The Competition Rules and Procedures shall be prepared by the Host Member Institute and shall be part of the Competition Document. The first announcement of the competition along with the Competition Document shall be mailed to all the Member Institutes, ACAE Representatives and to each institution listed in the Directory of Asian Architecture School, at least six months prior to the hosting of the Jamboree. Two further mailings, as reminders, shall be sent at intervals of one month to all the recipients.

20.5 Each Member Institute shall conduct the competition amongst the accredited schools within the country on the given theme and the time table and select two best entries as Country Submissions.

20.6 The Jury to assess the designs shall consist of five members, viz., the Chairman of ACAE, the three Vice Presidents of ARCASIA representing the three zones and the Convenor of the Student Jamboree. In the absence of any of the above, the Host Institute shall nominate one or more reputable architects as replacement(s). The jury shall deliberate at least one day prior to the inauguration of the Jamboree.

20.7 The three best entries shall be selected by the Jury. The first prize awarded by the Jury shall be called the ARCASIA Student Prize which will be a gold medal paid for by ARCASIA. The Host Institute shall announce suitable cash prizes to the second and third prize winners. All three shall also receive certificates signed by the Chairman ACAE and Convenor of the ARCASIA Student Competition.

### **21.0 Exhibition of ARCASIA Student Design Competition Entries**

21.1 The Host Institute shall arrange for all the entries to the Competition to be displayed in an exhibition space that is conveniently accessible to all the participants of the Asian Congress of Architects and the ARCASIA Student Jamboree as well as the lay public.

21.2 The exhibits shall be suitable tagged with the name and country of the participant and the submissions receiving the first, second and third prizes shall be prominently identified.

We have divided all of you into SIX Groups, identified as GROUP I, II, III, IV, V and VI. Each group will be further divided into SIX Sub-Groups which you will join, depending on your area of interest chosen from the six categories. The sub-groups will be identified as I-A, I-B, II-D, VI-C and so on. During the walk, members of each sub-group will document (photograph, sketch, video, record) only that theme/element chosen by that Sub-Group.

After the Walk, we will assemble at the UET campus for a Workshop, where each sub-group will collate and edit/arrange all the data the sub-group has gathered. The six sub-groups that form the larger Group will then come together to assimilate your observations and put together a presentation by which you can, **'Tell us a story'**, the story of Lahore. This story must be narrated with the help of Power Point through photographs, video, sketches, drawings, poetry, music, or, a combination of all these. Your call!

By the end of the evening, we expect to have six such stories , one from each Group, ready to be presented the following morning, October 28, to a larger audience that would include the Chairman and Office Bearers of ARCASIA and Presidents of the Institutes of Architects of 17 Asian countries.

# **ARCASIA Students' Architectural Design Competition 2010**

## **A. PREAMBLE**

The Architects' Regional Council Asia (ARCASIA) is a Council of the presidents of the National Institutes of architects of seventeen Asian countries that are members of ARCASIA. Every alternate year, an Asian Congress of Architects (ACA) is hosted by one of the member countries of ARCASIA. Parallel to the ACA is the ARCASIA Architectural Students' Jamboree at which student representatives from the seventeen countries meet to exchange ideas, discuss, debate and celebrate. They also get to attend the Congress sessions and official Dinners and have the opportunity to mingle with the region's leading architects. The Jamboree is organized by the host Institute under the aegis of the ARCASIA Committee for Architectural Education (ACAE).

The 14<sup>th</sup> Asian Congress of Architects (ACA-14) with the theme, "GO GREEN – The Architecture of the New Order", will be hosted at Lahore by the Institute of Architects, Pakistan (IAP), organized by its Lahore Chapter, from October 26-29, 2010. The ARCASIA Architectural Student Jamboree will be held concurrently.

In connection with the Jamboree, IAP is organizing the **ARCASIA Students' Architectural Design Competition 2010**, in conjunction with ACAE. The competition is open to 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year students of all the architecture schools that are accredited/recognized by the respective Institutes of Architects in the ARCASIA countries. Two best entries from each country as selected by the respective Institutes of Architects, shall be exhibited at the Jamboree in Lahore and the first, second and third prize winners shall be decided by an international jury. **The two students from each country whose designs are selected and represented at the exhibition shall also represent their respective countries as the official delegates to the ARCASIA Architectural Students' Jamboree 2010 at Lahore.** They will be the honoured guests of the Institute of Architects, Pakistan.

## **B. COMPETITION RULES**

### **1. THE THEME**

The countries of the Asian Region are blessed with very rich, but varied vernacular architectural traditions that have evolved over the centuries. A commonality of these traditions runs throughout the Region: The buildings that were created by the master builders were a natural and appropriate response to the context, to the different elements of nature, to religious and sociological demands and, incorporated in them, materials that were locally available, crafted by the ingenuity of the skilled artisans. This was a simple, natural process that culminated in the creation of an architecture that we would today refer to as 'sustainable' or 'green'.

## **ANNEXURE-04 (2/4)**

Drawing inspiration from the local building traditions of their own country, participating students are required to design a “**Children’s Resource Centre**”, an interactive, fun facility that educates the 21<sup>st</sup> century child on issues of ecology and sustainability and the preservation of related traditional knowledge and indigenous technologies.

## **2. THE SITE**

Students shall identify and select a corner, or a portion, of a mature public park in their city. The area of the selected portion of the park (the site) shall not be less than 2000 sqm and not exceed 2500 sqm and can be of any shape with existing physical feature(s) and contours that must be respected as far as possible in the design proposal.

## **3. SPATIAL REQUIREMENTS** (Built-up area not to exceed 700 sqm. in one/two floors)

- a) Reception/Congregation Space
- b) Display/Exhibition Area
- c) Library/Resource Room
- d) Audio-visual room (for 75 children)
- e) Cafeteria
- f) Toilets
- g) Administration & Maintenance Offices

## **4. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

### **i) Mandatory Submission**

- a) Photograph(s) of the site
- b) Site Analysis
- c) Concept Development
- d) Site Plan
- e) Floor Plan(s)
- f) Sections/Sectional Elevations
- g) 3-D Views

**Any other material that would supplement the mandatory submission requirements.**

ii) **Presentation must be limited to maximum 4 (four) sheets of A3 size** on a stiff, light mount for ease of packing and transport. Each sheet shall be numbered 1/4, 2/4, etc., and carry the title “**Children’s Resource Centre**”. The name of the student, the class, name of the school and its address, city and country shall be typed on paper in 14 pt Arial, signed and stamped by the head of the department or school and pasted on the obverse side of all the A3 size mounts. By affixing his/her signature, the head of the architecture department or school will have certified that the design is the original work of the student. The two official entries selected from each country shall be stamped and countersigned by the President or Vice President of the respective Institute of Architects on the obverse side of all the sheets that will be submitted. Name of the student or any identification number, name of school, city, country, etc., shall NOT be written on any of the presentation sheets.

iii) **Scale:** Floor Plan(s) and Sections to a scale of 1:100. For other drawings, any suitable scale. The drawings and all written material should be clearly legible. All written material shall be in the English language and all dimensions in metric units.

iv) **Medium:** There is no restriction on the medium, colours or techniques used in the four presentation sheets. Scale models are NOT allowed, although photographs of model can be made part of presentation.

vi) Jury constituted by Institute of Architects of each country to select two designs for submission as 'Country Entries' for ARCASIA Architectural Students Design Competition 2010: (latest by) Sept 15, 2010

vii) The two selected students to be informed by their respective Institutes and their names conveyed to the Convener, ARCASIA Students' Jamboree 2010: (latest by) Sept 20, 2010

viii) Dispatch of the two Country Entries to the Convener ARCASIA Students' Jamboree 2010: October 01, 2010

ix) Final Jury deliberations, announcement of prize winners and Exhibition at Lahore: October 25, 2010

#### NOTES:

i) **The competition is open to the students of 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year only.** It is recommended that the competition is treated as a class project within the design studio.

ii) The procedure to be adopted for selection of designs within the school and by the National Institute is entirely at the discretion of the school and the Institute.
