## President's Report

Architects Regional Council Asia (ARCASIA)

10 June 2012

It is with pleasure to welcome the Office Bearers to Lahore, hosted by the Institute of Architects Pakistan (IAP). The IAP's generous offer to host this present Office Bearers' Meeting is a sincere local hospitality to express mutual friendship and the show of unity by the architects of Pakistan. We, the ARCASIA, is proud to have the IAP as our outstanding member.

ARCASIA began the Year of the Dragon welcoming a new member institute to the Council. Association of Laos Architects and Civil Engineers (ALACE) became the 18<sup>th</sup> member of the ARCASIA. ALACE General Assembly was held on 24-25 February in Vientiane, with international guests from Korea, Singapore, Thailand and Japan. The Assembly featured international speakers from these nations. A meeting also was held to discuss ways to improve the quality of architectural education in Laos. Korea Architectural Accreditation Board (KAAB), a national accreditation system with UIA Validation, acted as the advising organization to ALACE on their effort. During the General Assembly, The First Annual ALACE National Architectural Awards were also announced.

In Boracay, Philippines, during the UAP Architects' Summit o Collaborative Action and Leadership, ARCASIA launched the ARCASIA Committee for Social Responsibility (ACSR), headed by Ar. Joseph Kwan, former Council Member of the UIA Region IV and the the past Chairman of the UIA Work Programme on Social Responsibility. ARCASIA Office Bearers attended the Region IV Meeting chaired by Esa Mohamed, Vice President of Region IV. The meeting re-affirmed the cooperation between UIA Region IV and ARCASIA.

In Tangiers, I had an opportunity to attend the gathering of the African Union of Architects (AUA), the UIA Professional Practice Commission and the Regional Presidents' Meeting hosted by the AUA and the National Order of Architects of Morocco. In the UIA Professional Practice Commission. Ar. Balbir Verma, Ar. Shinjiro Wachi, Ar. Ishitiaeque Zahir from the ARCASIA region were in attendance.

On the occasion of the Farewell Dinner, ARCASIA, was a signatory of the "Tangier Declaration" signed on 16 March, by the Presidents of the three regional organizations: African Union of Architects, (AUA), Architects Council of Europe (ACE) and ARCASIA, and endorsed by the President of Pan American Federation of Architects Association (FAPAA). The Declaration "...call on the UIA Council and the Vision and the Strategy Committee to strengthen and include the existing regional architectural organization in the effective mutual cooperation... and commit to further develop mutual multi- and bi-lateral cooperation between the regional organizations leading to innovative, inclusive and unison representation of the global architectural community."

In April, the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP) hosted the UIA Council Meeting coinciding with their National Convention, held in Manila. Unfortunately, due to my responsibility in teaching at the beginning of the academic year, I had to be excused from attending the meeting which was held in our ARCASIA region. Our colleagues of the UAP provided impressive hospitality to our friends from the UIA global regions.

Also in April, I was invited by President Selma Harrington of Architects Council of Europe (ACE) to participate in the General Assembly of ACE in Amsterdam. On 27 April 2012, during the session of the Assembly, ACE and ARCASIA signed a MOU to officially launch a cooperative relationship between two organizations. There was a meeting held between the UIA, AUA, ARCASIA, with the acknowledgement of ACE on 27 April in Hotel Mercure. The

meeting clarified some misunderstanding which occurred, between the UIA and the regional organization regarding the objective of the Tangier Declaration. Participating regional organizations will support the efforts of the UIA and will collaborate on many issues confronting our profession.

President Kunihiro also participated in the 12<sup>th</sup> European Forum on Eco-Innovation held, also in Amsterdam, on 25-26 April.

In addition to the official duty as the President of ARCASAIA, I was invited by the Malaysian Institute of Architects (PAM) to be on a Master Jury for their PAM Award 2012. Along with Ar. Saifuddin Ahmed, President of PAM, Ar. Teo Ah Khing, Professor Ramil Abdullah, Goh Suk Keat, the Master Jury met twice, during April and May to select winners in several categories of the Award. The Award Ceremony and Dinner was held on 8 June in Kuala Lumpur, where I had a privilege of witnessing the winners being given this year's prestigious PAM Award.

In May, I attended the 2012 National Convention of the American Institute of Architects, where I participated in the International Presidents' Forum. Along with the President of ACE, FPAA, FIKA, JIA, ASC, Australian Institute of Architects, RIBA, Mexican Federation of Architects, Costa Rica Institute of Architects, Royal Canadian Institute of Architects and U.S. collateral organizations.

ARCASIA delegation included Ar. Sathirut Tandanand, Vice President Zone B and Ar. Anna Kwong, Vice President Zone C.

At the Investiture Ceremony, Ar. Li Xiaodong of China was inducted into the College of Fellows as an Honorary Fellow of the AIA.

ARCASIA will host the 15<sup>th</sup> Asian Congress of Architects, organized by the Institute of Architects Indonesia (IAI) in the exotic island of Bali, from 28 October through 2 November. The preparation for the Congress is progressing in comfortable pace. The speakers are beginning to line up. We congratulate the Organizing Committee of ACA-15 for their hard work thus far.

We hope many of the participants will join us from the member sections of all the regions of the UIA. Theme of the Congress is: "Modernism Challenge: Asian Cities and Architecture Heritage in a New Paradigm". <http://arcasiabali2012.com/>

In conclusion, I would like to say that, since October 2011, the AUA, ACE and ARCASIA have been active in our execution of the MOU. We have met twice, in Tangier and Amsterdam, to continue our dialog to develop further relationship amongst the regional organizations.

I am looking forward to inviting the Presidents of the affiliated organizations to attend our ACA-15 in Bali, to participate in the proposed "International President Forum" .

## 2.1.2 CONTINUITY

## **CONTINUITY**

### **Ar. Kalim A. Siddiqui**

The present members of the ARCASIA Council which consists of all the Presidents of each member countries and all the committees entrusted with various tasks are actually the custodians of the organization. But the council is only there for a term of two years until a new council takes up the charge for the next two years and so on.

Hence, the goal is not only to care, nurture and uphold the objectives, images and identity of ARCASIA for a given time period but to transfer the same to the future council member as well as future generation of ARCASIA.

It also means that the objectives or goals set up the founding members should be “CONTINUED” from the Past via Present to Future!!

To maintain the **CONTINUITY** of the vision of ARCASIA, we have to review the initially formulated objectives of ARCASIA, and evaluate it in the present time about the combined attainment of those objectives versus unachieved ambitions. So the 10 years plan of ARCASIA proposed by Nui should be the **CONTINUATION** towards fulfillment of those unachieved objectives/ambitions of founders of ARCASIA and its first committee of ACAE.

In the light of the above we have to evaluate the objectives of ARCASIA as follows:-

1. To unite National Institutes of Architects on a democratic basis throughout the Asian region, to foster friendly, Intellectual, artistic, educational and scientific ties.

This objective has been successfully carried out so far but needs to be expanded to cover whole of the Asian region. Potential future members are: Chinese Taipei, Myanmar, Brunei, Bhutan & Maldives.

2. To represent architects of the Member Institutes at national and international levels.

This aspect has been done successfully with national level initiatives

3. To promote the recognition of the architect's role in society.

The idea of having a Social Responsibility Committee is the first step in this direction which has been setup most recently with Joseph as its convenor.

A 15 minute presentation on "Green Architectural & Sustainable Design in Pakistan" as requested by the ARCASIA Committee on social responsibility will be presented on 21<sup>st</sup> Oct. 2012 at ACA-15, Bali Indonesia

4. To foster and maintain professional contacts, mutual cooperation and assistance among Member Institutes.

We see that the standards of professional practice vary from one Member Institute to other due to differing registration process, licensing policies and implementation of law in various countries. There is an urgent need to raise the standards of professional practice for each member institute. Hence, the Arcasia Professional Practice Committee (APPC) should begin work towards achieving mutual cooperation and assistance among Member Institutes, to work towards international licensing and Cross Border Practice (CBP) which will initiate uniformity in professional practice standards at some level amongst the ARCASIA community.

5. To promote the development and education of architects and architectural professional in their service to society.

This can be realized by a more vigorously pursued Continuous Professional Development (CPD) program in each country. This is one of the programs which can be initiated at ARCASIA level for the overall development of the professionals in the region so as to achieve uniformity in profession training with a focus to improve and uplift the capacity and ability of architects in their own countries as well as for getting better results and understanding for possible Cross Border Practice. 'ARCASIA CPD' program with suitable credits should become a symbol of professional development. This would hence become a guideline and an opportunity of learning for member countries that are yet to begin with the compulsory CPD programs in their country.

In this regard I have initiated the introduction of the CPD programme for registered Architects for Pakistan. I will be shortly submitting a report on this subject to IAP National Council for adoption.

6. To promote research and technical advancement in the field of the built environment.

Not yet addressed, giving recognition to the researcher may be the first step to start with on this agenda. However, collaborative and cooperative research activity with other international agencies like (UNESCO, UNHABITAT etc) could be a step forward in this direction. Each member country to be represented in this research activity and should strive to seek for research participation relevant to each region. Would suggest instituting an award to be known as ARCASIA Award for research and publication which is specific to the region.

- 7) The other important aspect of the “Continuity” factor lies in the realization of objectives of ARCASIA Committee on Architectural Education (ACAE). When we work on a professional level it is sometimes even more important to start from the grass roots level.

In this regard, most of the objectives may be achieved through establishment of an ARCASIA Accreditation Board. This could be established on the pattern of CAA.

Cross boarder internship program should be started immediately with serious effort.

Student exchange program is also very vital for cross border understanding and exchange of information among the younger architects, students as well as faculty members.

Such programs when started on the grass root level (student level), will bring out a continuity and uniformity in the professional practice in the ARCASIA region.

An interactive web site will help in bringing the ARCASIA region’s students closer.

- 8) A public relations campaign should be designed for exposure of ARCASIA in the region and also globally to project the image of ARCASIA. It is suggested that a short video in the form of a documentary may be produced highlighting salient feature points of ARCASIA and what it stands for and its achievements.

HAVE AGREED on this ARCASIA Mutual Recognition Arrangement on Architectural CPD Programmes (hereinafter referred to as “this Arrangement”) as follows:

## ARTICLE 1 OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this Arrangement are:

- 1.1 to facilitate the improvement of architectural practice.
- 1.2 to exchange information in order to promote best practice on standards of architectural practice.
- 1.3 to conform to the spirit of ARCASIA Cooperations based on fair distribution of resources and benefits through collaborative researches; and
- 1.4 to encourage, facilitate and establish mutual recognition of Architects and set up standards and commitments of technological transfer among ARCASIA Member Institutions.

## ARTICLE 2 IMPLEMENTATION

Professional Regulatory Authority (PRA) of each participating ARCASIA Member Institution shall be responsible for the following:

- 2.1 shall approve the cross border participation in each ARCASIA Member Institution CPD Programmes.
- 2.2 Monitor, assess, and recognize the CPD Courses given by each ARCASIA Member Institution.

2.3 The attendance of each ARCASIA Member Institute's National Convention can be used towards CPD Points.

Following are the minutes of the meeting:

### 1. UIA 2014 Durban Congress

- The meeting resolved that the UIA, to avoid any further misunderstanding, will withdraw the present Keynote Speaker and nominate another jointly with the AUA
- The UIA accepts and endorses the One Congress as agreed between SAIA and AUA (proposed by the AUA) on the proviso that a more convenient date and time is decided for the AUA Election programme (not to clash with the commencement of the UIA General Assembly).
- UIA assures all of ensuring a better flow between the Durban CC & OC.
- AUA demanded that the communication of the OC should be encouraged to be dissipated in at least English & French (Portuguese to be explored) to encourage full participation of the Continents French speaking member sections.
- UIA will propose to SAIA to invite the AUA President at each CC.
- AUA's clarification on 'if income is realised' helped to understand the aims & objectives of the Union on this issue.

- UIA proposes the 'Legacy Project' as one for Africa in recognition/ and to compensate the AUA support and effort to ensure a big success at Durban 2014.

## 2. TANGIER DECLARATION

- ARCASIA & the AUA Presidents clarified the aims & objectives of Tangier Declaration being one to 'Strengthen' the UIA, and to this as reported is in the collaboration with the ACE & FPAA as signed in this regard.
- The meeting further reviewed, as an example, the position of the UIA on education i.e. the UIA/ UNESCO Charter on Education, which unfortunately recommends with no implementation is one among others the Regional bodies will now take up to strengthen the UIA and improve the global architectural community.
- The misunderstanding of the UIA not being represented at the meeting of the Regional Presidents was clarified and accepted by UIA
- Finally UIA agrees to explore Tangier Declaration further by requesting her VP for the regions to dialogue with the Tangier Declaration stakeholders and establish recommendations to council for adoption and where necessary to develop for presentation at the next General Assembly in Durban.

## 2. UIA & AUAMoU

- UIA assured all of responding to the AUAMoU draft sent since Jan 2012.
- It was agreed by all that this MoU will be implemented with another specific task. 'Durban 2014' which need the collective efforts of both Unions to ensure a big success.
- The MoU as assured by the UIA will be effected on or before her next Council meeting in Oct. 2012.
- To that effect the UIA SG will send the amended draft MoU to the AUA President for final comments and consideration.
- UIA further agreed that prompt action will be adopted considering the quantum intended to be achieved before and at Durban 2014.

- UIA agreed to make good the misunderstanding expressed at her last council meeting in Manila to all which could be expressed as follows:
  - a. The UIA President and SG met with the Regional Organisations Presidents of AUAT. Omisore and ARCASIA G. Kunihiro, in presence of F. Oussidhoum, AUA Director of External Relations IA and G Siew UIA Past President.
  - b.. All misunderstandings regarding on the Tangier Declaration were cleared and the respective positions of each organization clarified and respected based on the careful examination of the text conducted during the UIA Council meeting in Manila

This will now be the basis future positive collaboration among themselves.”
