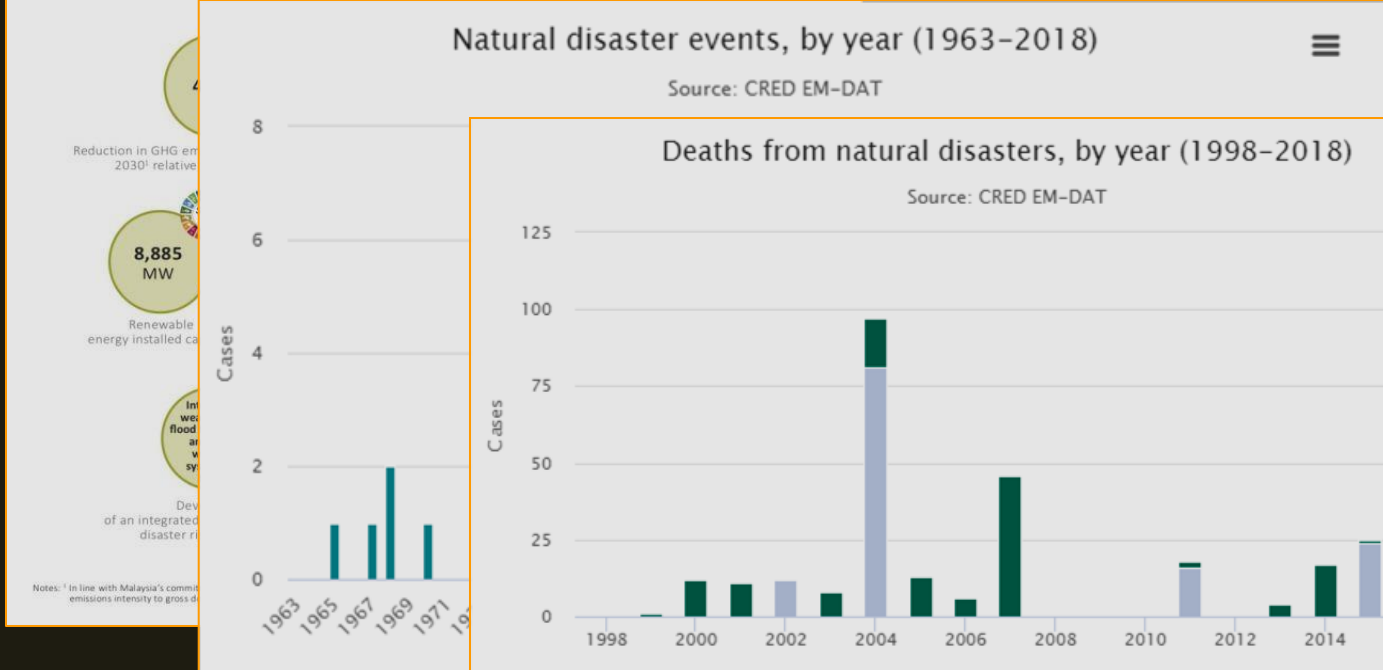

PAM Student Award to recognise outstanding young Malaysian Architectural Graduates

KUALA LUMPUR, Jan 11 (Bernama) – The Pertubuhan Akitek Malaysia (PAM) today launched the PAM Student Award 2019 to recognise and reward outstanding Malaysian talents amongst the upcoming batch of architectural graduates.

PAM in a statement said the award, which aimed at promoting innovation, merit and excellence among the youth in the field of architecture, is open to all Malaysians who graduated last year.

“There will be two categories of the award, namely the PAM Silver Medal for Master and Bachelor of Architecture graduates, while the PAM Bronze Medal for Bachelor of Science of Architecture graduates or its equivalent.

“The award winners will be selected through a rigorous two-stage selection process of their architectural portfolios with interviews by a panel of experts,” the statement said.

Submissions for the PAM Student Award will be open from Jan 10 onwards and the closing date for Stage One submissions will be on March 8.

The presentation ceremony will take place in June 2019, the statement said.

The PAM Student Award was introduced in 2012 and is the highest accolade for Malaysian architectural graduates and students by the national organisation for architects.

Ribut/ Taufan ialah tiupan angin kencang yang boleh mengakibatkan kemusnahan bangunan, harta benda, tumbuhan dan mengancam nyawa. Keadaan ini lazimnya berlaku secara serta-merta dan dalam tempoh yang sekelip mata. Anda hendaklah:

- Jangan panik.

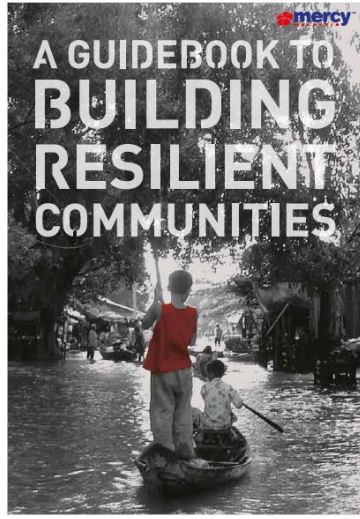

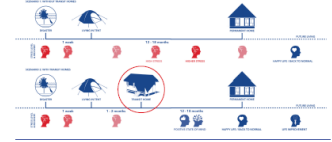

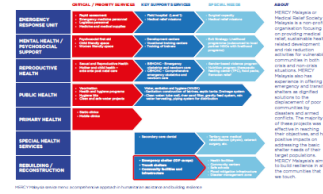
REBUILDING COMMUNITIES THROUGH CHD TEP

The monsoon period of end 2014 and early 2015 was unusually severe. Nature's fury was unleashed, over several weeks, on a broad swathe of the north-east corner of Peninsular Malaysia. The intensity and scale of the flood caught many by surprise. Over a quarter million people in low-lying communities were displaced and in urgent need of shelter, food and water, and medical care. Heavy showers, which added to the flood, led to the deaths of many.

1. Recognizing that “stash, not burn, to earn additional income” as a fresh approach to solving haze problem
2. Noting that the proposed conversion of biomass to energy would be viable
3. Recognizing that water management is critical in peat areas
4. Recognizing that not at all times transboundary haze could be effectively controlled
5. Acknowledging that El Nino does significantly influence the severity of haze, and that it is now possible to predict any El Nino event six months ahead of time since well-established forecasting systems are already in place
6. Noting that there are still gaps in knowledge
7. How can current scientific knowledge be synthesized and translated into policy-relevant information to aid policy and decision-making management and to suggest further research?
8. Realizing that peatland issues are highly complex and that knowledge on these issues have thus far been mostly tailored for the scientific community, it is imperative to establish a systematic effort to reframe and communicate these issues to the public using common and accessible language
